Technical theatre jobs encompass six basic areas for technical work: scene shops, costume shops, theatre electricians, properties artisans, stage managers, and scenic/hair/make-up artists; as well as equivalent positions in film, digital video and new media production.

Associate in Arts in THEATRE ARTS for Transfer AA-T

The Associate in Arts in Theatre Arts for Transfer (AA-T in Theater Arts) degree is intended for students who plan to transfer and complete a bachelor's degree in Theatre Arts, or a major deemed similar by the CSU campus. Students completing this degree are guaranteed admission to the CSU system, but not necessarily to a particular CSU campus or major of their choice. Students should consult with a counselor for more information on university admission and transfer requirements as this AA-T in Theatre Arts degree may not be the best option for students intending to transfer to a particular CSU campus or to a college or university that is not part of the CSU system.

To earn an AA-T in Theatre Arts, students must complete the following:

1. 60 semester or 90 quarter CSU transferable units.
2. Minimum grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.0 in all CSU transferable coursework. While a minimum of 2.0 is required for admission, some majors may require a higher GPA.
3. 18 specified major units. All courses in the major must be completed with a grade of C or better (Title 5 §55063).
4. Certified completion of the California State University General Education-Breadth (CSU GE) pattern or the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC for CSU) pattern.

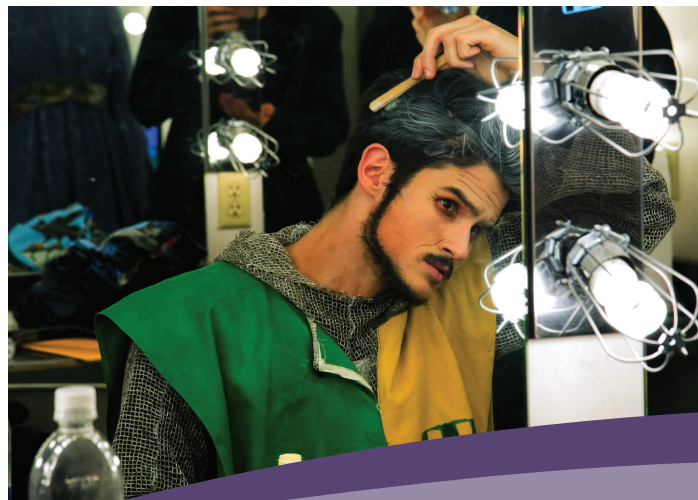
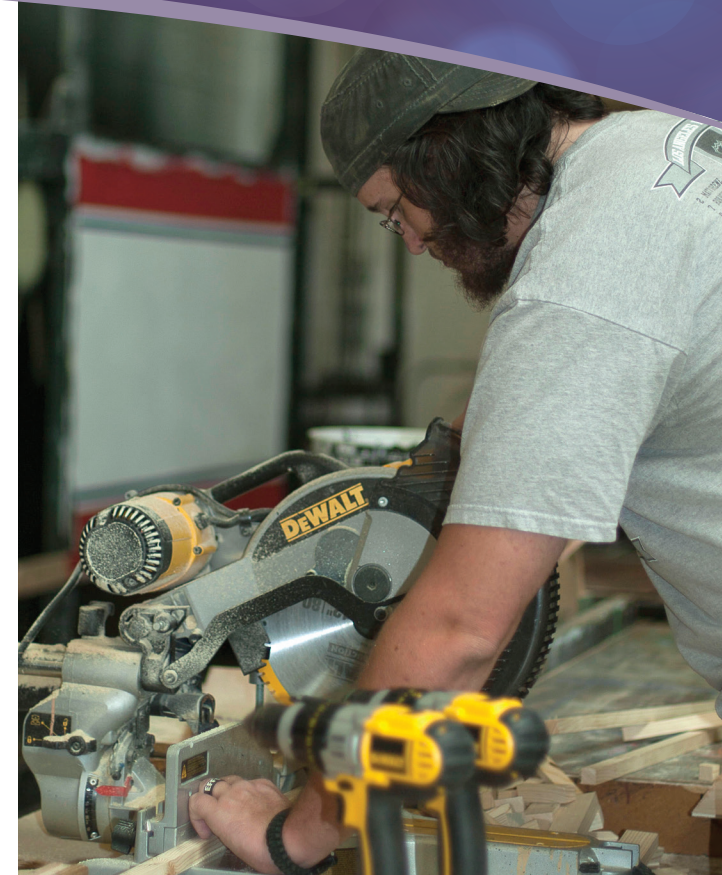
