	<p>rates, pass/fail rates, etc. – faculty can choose to share their data, or not. One member was very surprised that there were groups in her classroom that were being disadvantaged. She would like to implement it on the MC campus by building a community of interested instructors, sharing data, evaluating and recognizing issues, and providing support</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Vince Crisostomos – Spoke on a session to help colleagues buy in to professional development ideas that were seen at the conference. Need to focus on one idea (Equity) – Faculty should look at their own data, close Fall to Spring attrition, and close Equity gaps. Need data on success rates to be disaggregated into cohorts by ethnicity, gender, socioeconomic, and special populations (Vets, Foster Youth, ACCESS, ESL, etc.) The end goal is to build a group of champions to work on a pilot program. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Lisa Putnam spoke about how data is currently organized by discipline level. New approach would be to split by instructor to allow for improving upon best practices and learning from each other. ▪ Jill McCall was concerned with the cohort/sample size. Do you make a major course correction based on a small cohort’s results? (Yes, but adjustments are made with caution) ○ Ashley Vaughan – Provided a handout on teaching to student strengths. Student focus groups can provide qualitative data, rather than just quantitative data. The session on student strengths contained very easily adopted suggestions. 21st century skills are already present in students and can translate easily to the classroom. The Growth Mindset – talk to students about the biology of the mind and how it can grow (you tube video on neural pathways), Action sheets on brainstorming, Grading sheets allow students to graph their own grade after each assignment or test. ○ Jesus Vega – was impacted the most by a session on disenfranchised AB540/Dream Act students. We have 188 AB540 students at MC. The only service offered to them is Financial Aid. The CCCApply site asks the students, “What services can we provide?” however, this information is only used for reporting. Jesus is working with April & Rocio to determine how to better use the student service requests to offer the services needed. Jesus would like to set up a “Dream Center” to help AB540 students with services, such as legal, immigration, etc., which would allow them to focus more on their studies. He is trying to work with a professional development person at CalState Long Beach, whose specialty is finding services for AB540 students. He would like to tour other campuses that have Dream Centers, such as Norco CC, Fresno City, and CSU CI. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student Equity/SSSP Coordinator’s Training <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ SSSP Update <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ SSSP was mandated in 2012 and Legislative Analyst Office is required to provide report

	<p>on its progress every two years. 2016 report include five recommendations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Strengthen requirement: possibly block registration till all 3SP is completed • Standardize the way equity gap analysis is evaluated • Change the scorecard – every 3 years rather than every 6 • Evidence based practices – direct 3SP funds toward effective practices • Use student educational plans to drive student enrollment management <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Student Success Workgroup <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Workgroup met and discussed LAO 2nd report findings on SSSP. The group discussed benefits and challenges of blocking new student registration until all 3 mandatory steps are completed • One suggestion was to allow first time enrollment but block registration for their 2nd semester ○ Equity Update <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Training was primarily geared toward new directors/deans ▪ Lisa stated that the equity contact at the state has retired, so it may take longer to get assistance. Looking at integrating templates. Expenditures must be tied to the equity plan
