	SSSP Data Presentation		
		Lisa/Rocio	
	 Rocio stated that Tableau Software is very user friendly and the data is presented in a useful way using pictures/charts, rather than just numerical tables. The charts are built with data provided by 		
	the CCC Chancellors office. The presentation she showed compared retention and success rates for		
	student populations that have completed Orientation, an Education Plan, and Assessment versus		
	students who did not. The data is disaggregated at a high level, but will eventually be broken down into more detail.		
	 Overall, data showed that students who completed mandatory SSSP requirements had higher 		
	success, persistence, and retention rates than students who did not complete the new student		
	steps.		
	 Questions: 		
	 Are more motivated students the ones who complete the orientation, assessment, and 		
	education plan, potentially skewing the data? (Yes, most likely) How are cohorts determined by the CCC Chancellor's office? (It's raw data, we break into

	 Who can access Tableau? (It depends on the person and on the report) 		
	 Are students not completing the orientation because they don't know about it? (Likely) 		
	 How can we get the word out about 3SP? (Suggestions: needs to be given to students by the faculty, as they are the ones with the most student contact; Information needs to be 		
	timely and meaningful; Alert students who have not completed by having a pop up on the		
	student portal; Emphasize the impact of losing their priority registration – Kim Korinke		
	pointed out the enrollment priority videos already produced by VC and mentioned that they are working on similar videos); These reports are a base point and allow us to know		
	where to begin and which populations to potentially target for help; Data pulls from		
	Tableau are a snapshot in time, not pulling live data.

	 Howard stated that purpose of reporting out is to share the wealth of knowledge obtained at this 		
	conference o Farisa Morales – Spoke on the breakout equity group – 5 faculty from Butte College – "Equity"		
	begins in the classroom" – Started a pilot project to expose faculty to their own data on attrition		

- rates, pass/fail rates, etc. faculty can choose to share their data, or not. One member was very surprised that there were groups in her classroom that were being disadvantaged. She would like to implement it on the MC campus by building a community of interested instructors, sharing data, evaluating and recognizing issues, and providing support
- Vince Crisostomos Spoke on a session to help colleagues buy in to professional development ideas that were seen at the conference. Need to focus on one idea (Equity) Faculty should look at their own data, close Fall to Spring attrition, and close Equity gaps. Need data on success rates to be disaggregated into cohorts by ethnicity, gender, socioeconomic, and special populations (Vets, Foster Youth, ACCESS, ESL, etc.) The end goal is to build a group of champions to work on a pilot program.
 - Lisa Putnam spoke about how data is currently organized by discipline level. New
 approach would be to split by instructor to allow for improving upon best practices and
 learning from each other.
 - Jill McCall was concerned with the cohort/sample size. Do you make a major course correction based on a small cohort's results? (Yes, but adjustments are made with caution)
- Ashley Vaughan Provided a handout on teaching to student strengths. Student focus groups can
 provide qualitative data, rather than just quantitative data. The session on student strengths
 contained very easily adopted suggestions. 21st century skills are already present in students and
 can translate easily to the classroom. The Growth Mindset talk to students about the biology of
 the mind and how it can grow (you tube video on neural pathways), Action sheets on
 brainstorming, Grading sheets allow students to graph their own grade after each assignment or
 test.
- Jesus Vega was impacted the most by a session on disenfranchised AB540/Dream Act students. We have 188 AB540 students at MC. The only service offered to them is Financial Aid. The CCCApply site asks the students, "What services can we provide?" however, this information is only used for reporting. Jesus is working with April & Rocio to determine how to better use the student service requests to offer the services needed. Jesus would like to set up a "Dream Center" to help AB540 students with services, such as legal, immigration, etc., which would allow them to focus more on their studies. He is trying to work with a professional development person at CalState Long Beach, whose specialty is finding services for AB540 students. He would like to tour other campuses that have Dream Centers, such as Norco CC, Fresno City, and CSU CI.
