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### CSU TRANSFER and CSU- GE INFORMATION MOORPARK COLLEGE - 2015-2016

#### What is the CSU-GE Pattern?

The California State University (CSU) General Education (GE) refers to the pattern of general education courses that students can complete at Moorpark College (MC) to fulfill general education and admission requirements to any California State University (CSU) campus.

#### Is CSU GE required for transfer to a CSU campus?

**No**. The CSU GE **not** an admission requirement for transfer to the CSU, nor does completing it guarantee admission to the campus or program of choice.

#### What are the minimum CSU requirements for an upperdivision (Junior) transfer student?

An upper-division transfer student must complete 60 CSU transferable semester (90 quarter) units, with a minimum 2.0 grade point average (2.4 for non-California residents). Within the transferable courses, there must be 30 semester (45 quarter) units of general education coursework which includes

- > oral communication (Area A1),
- > written communication (Area A2),
- > critical thinking (Area A3) and,
- > mathematics (Area B4).

These four sections (A1-A3, B4) of general education must be completed with a grade of C or better for each course. In addition, students must be in good standing at the last college or university attended (i.e. eligible to re-enroll at that college or university).

#### Transferring to CSU with an ADT

The Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADTs) are degrees that are designed especially for transfer to the CSU system. The degrees are the result of SB1440. These degrees can be completed in 60 CSU transferable semester (90 quarter) units and include coursework in general education, major preparation and/or electives.

Students who have completed an Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) or an Associate in Science for Transfer (AS-T) and are admitted to a CSU major that has been deemed similar are guaranteed admission at junior standing, and have the opportunity to complete a baccalaureate degree with 60 additional semester (90 quarter) units. Please schedule an appointment with a MC counselor to discuss the ADTs available at MC.

#### What is CSU GE certification?

Certification refers to official notification from MC that a student transferring to any CSU campus has completed courses fulfilling CSU lower-division general education requirements.

To obtain full certification, a student must complete 39 units in the designed general education areas (Areas A-E). All courses in Area A1-A3 and B4 must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Students admitted to a CSU campus with full certification shall not be held to any additional lower-division general education requirements. However, full certification does not exempt students from unmet lower-division graduation requirement that may exist outside of the general education program of the campus awarding the degree.

#### Is partial CSU-GE certification available?

Yes, it is possible to complete separately any of the areas (A-E) at MC and receive partial certification in any or several of these areas; if not fully certified, it will be necessary to complete the remaining areas (and perhaps other areas) after transferring as defined by the catalog of the transfer school.

#### Can external credit examinations be applied to CSU GE?

**Yes.** Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and College Level Examination Program (CLEP) exams may be included in the CSU certification of general education requirements in accordance with the CSU Executive Order 1036, Section 1.2.4. Students wishing to use units awarded for AP, IB, or CLEP should check with a Counselor.

## Can the History, Constitution and American Ideals graduation requirement be completed before transfer?

All campuses require students to complete college-level coursework in U.S. History, American Government and California Government, in addition to GE requirements for graduation. Courses approved to satisfy this requirement are specified in appropriate areas. CSU campuses may permit double counting of courses taken to meet this requirement and GE-Breadth if the student is partially or fully certified.

### Can students complete CSU GE coursework at more than one college?

Yes. MC may certify courses taken from another California community college or another CSU campus if they were approved for CSU-GE at the time they were completed. The certification placement will be in the CSU-GE area approved at the college where they were completed. If the courses were completed at a regionally accredited institution that does not maintain a certified CSU-GE list, the courses will be evaluated for placement by the MC Counselor.

## Can a course be used to satisfy a CSU-GE requirement and a major requirement?

**Yes.** A course may be used for both requirements for most majors on most CSU campuses, but there may be exceptions to this rule. Please check with a MC counselor or at **www.assist.org** for more information.

#### What is ASSIST?

The Articulation System Stimulating Interinstitutional Student Transfer (ASSIST) is an online student-transfer information system that shows how course credits earned at one public California college or university can be applied when transferred to another. ASSIST is the official repository of articulation for California's public colleges and universities and provides the most accurate and up-to-date information about student transfer in California.
