AGREEMENT FOR AN ARTICULATION PROGRAM BETWEEN

MOORPARK COLLEGE

AND

AMERICAN JEWISH UNIVERSITY

I. INTRODUCTION

Based upon a mutual respect for the integrity of parallel academic programs and in an effort to better serve students to pursue a Bachelor's degree, Moorpark College and the American Jewish University (AJU) hereby enter into an agreement for an articulation program. This agreement will define course work to be completed at Moorpark College for a student intending to matriculate at AJU, special terms of admission to AJU and special criteria for the awarding of the Bachelor's degree to participating students. This would facilitate the transfer for students from Moorpark College who wish to complete the last two years of their undergraduate studies at AJU.

II. OBJECTIVES OF THE AGREEMENT

To attract qualified students to the American Jewish University, particularly those who are interested in the type of high quality programs offered at the AJU.

To facilitate the transition of students from Moorpark College to AJU.

To provide special advising for students of Moorpark College who intend to pursue their undergraduate studies at AJU.

To encourage academic and administrative coordination between the two institutions and the exchange of evaluation information pertaining to the outcome of the program with the goal of continual improvement.

III. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Under the provision of this program, students will complete up to 60 credits of course work at Moorpark College, including the courses outlined in this agreement, or substitutes approved by the AJU's Dean of Arts and Sciences.

Students are admitted into Moorpark College as incoming freshmen or as qualified transfer students under the established condition of Moorpark College. While enrolled at Moorpark College, students will complete all required course work, with an explicit attempt to take as many courses as possible from the attached list and as described in the Moorpark College Academic Catalogue.

Transferable courses not specifically mentioned in the attached list of equivalents will be reviewed upon admission by the appropriate department advisor for possible use as prerequisites for the student's major. Transferred courses not used may be accepted for elective credit.

The acceptance of credits via transfer or testing toward completion of degree requirements shall be governed by current AJU policies including, but not limited to the following:

4a. Only courses with a grade of "C" or better will be considered transferable to the AJU.

4b. Credits that are over 15 years old are subject to special evaluation and approval by the AJU's Dean of Arts and Sciences.

Students who apply to AJU will complete all required application procedures thereafter in a timely matter, including submission of recommendations and/or any other required parts of the process.

Once admitted to the AJU, students must complete a minimum of 60 units in residence.

Students shall pay the appropriate tuition and fees to each institution for all course work taken at that institution. Students shall not be registered unless they resolve satisfactorily their financial obligations to Moorpark College prior to matriculation.

IV. MUTUAL PROMOTION OF THE PROGRAM

Moorpark College and AJU both agree to encourage qualified students to participate in this articulation program through advisement and dissemination of information. The academic counselors at Moorpark College will make every effort to refer interested students to AJU's articulation agreement and advise them through the transfer process.

Both institutions agree to promote the articulation program to suitable and interested students in their recruitment activities and in their student affairs events through literature and when appropriate refer prospective students to AJU Office of Admissions.

V. STUDENT ADVISEMENT

Academic advisors from Moorpark College's Transfer/Counseling Center shall be responsible for advising students regarding their academic preparation for admission to the AJU and for their ultimate goal of matriculation at the AJU. Care will be taken to make students aware of the requirements and the agreement regarding transfer of credits.

VI. REVIEW, CONTINUATION AND TERMINATION OF THE AGREEMENT

This agreement shall be in effect only while both the AJU and Moorpark College are in good standing with WASC. Failure to receive WASC-ACSCU or WASC-ACCJC accreditation at any time is grounds for the termination of this agreement.

This agreement shall be reviewed when deemed necessary by either party and revised as appropriate, due to curriculum changes at either institution, changes in AJU entrance requirements, or other reasons.

This agreement shall be in force until either institution makes a decision to terminate it.
