COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

PREREQUISITES, COREQUISITES & OTHER CONDITIONS

Prerequisites for Mathematics and English will be enforced prior to registration. Students who have completed courses at another college or at the high school level that could be equivalent to the prerequisites needed to register for courses at Moorpark College should have official transcripts sent to the Counseling Office to expedite the review process. Students may also hand carry official (unopened) transcripts to the Counseling Office prior to registration. Transcripts must be reviewed by a counselor to verify college course equivalencies and to determine how high school courses meet the stated prerequisites. Additional documentation may also be required such as a course outline of a previously completed course. After review by a counselor a Prerequisite for Course Equivalency Form can be completed and signed and submitted to the Admissions and Records Office at the time of registration for the desired course. Students who believe they have met the prerequisite in ways other than through completing an equivalent course may file a Petition to Challenge. The petition outlines the specific reasons students may give for challenging a prerequisite or corequisite. Petition to Challenge forms and instructions are available from a counselor in the Administration Building.

IMPORTANT DEFINITIONS

PREREQUISITE: Courses that must be completed with a grade of "C" or better prior to registration in a specific course.

COREQUISITE: A course a student is required to take simultaneously in order to enroll in another specific course.

RECOMMENDED PREPARATION: Courses that should be completed prior to or in conjunction with a specific course.

CONDITIONS FOR ENROLLMENT: Other restrictions such as "Proof of negative TB clearance" (Child Development Course).

ANATOMY

ANAT M01 Human Anatomy_____

__4.00 Units

PREREQUISITES: BIOL M01 or BIOL M02A

Examines the anatomy of human organs and organ systems from a functional perspective that focuses on an understanding of the design of the human body. In laboratory, students learn to distinguish tissue types through histological specimens, and study the three-dimensional relationship of body structures through required non-human mammalian dissection. Demonstrations on human cadavers will afford students a working knowledge of the gross anatomy of the human body. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU; UC (ANAT M01 and ANPH M01 or PHSO M01 combined: maximum credit, one course). IGETC AREA 5B. CAN: BIOL 10

ANATOMY/PHYSIOLOGY

ANPH M01 Introduction to Human Anatomy and Physiology

5.00 Unit

PREREQUISITES: BIOL M01 or BIOL M02A

Introduces the structures and the relationships of human body parts and explores how the functioning of the parts is related to their structure. The combined study of anatomy and physiology allows students to effectively integrate the study of structure with functioning of the system. The themes of hierarchal structural organization and maintenance of homeostasis form the framework for the study of the human system at both macroscopic and microscopic levels. In laboratory, student will examine the structure/ function relationship through the required dissection of a cat. A human cadaver will be used to demonstrate the principles in the human body. A variety of instruments and techniques will be introduced to assess functioning in the living body. The emphasis in both lecture and laboratory is on student understanding of systems integration and co-dependence. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU; UC (ANPH M01 and ANAT M01 or PHSO M01 combined: maximum credit, one course). IGETC AREA 5B.

ANIMAL SCIENCE

ANSC M02 Animal Health and Safety

2.00 Units

Introduces the health and safety issues associated with keeping animals in captivity. Presents the essentials of a preventative medicine program, emphasizing procedures for proper hygiene, quarantine, vaccinations, and safety. Addresses the safety of the animal keeper/handler with a consideration of zoonosis. Applies to Associate Degree.

ANSC M04 Units Animal Behavior

3.00 Units

Introduction to the study of animal behavior with an emphasis on learning theory, especially classical and operant conditioning. It is designed to provide the student with an understanding of how to apply the concepts of ethology and behavior modification to the maintenance and training of animals in captivity. (Same course as PSY M12). Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU

0.50 Unit

Unit Animal Behavior Lab

COREQUISITE: ANSC M04 or PSY M12

Consists of laboratory activities giving the student opportunities to develop skills in behavior modification and observational research. Each student will be required to train a rat and conduct an observational research project on captive mammals. (Same course as PSY M12L) Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU

Animal Anatomy/Physiology ANSC M06

3.00 Units

An introduction to the science of veterinary medicine as it applies to mammals, birds, and reptiles. Presents a practical system-by-system approach to the basic structure (anatomy) and function (physiology) of the previously mentioned groups. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU

3.00 Units

Animal Diversity Lab_

Introductory laboratory course surveys the invertebrate and vertebrate animals, both terrestrial and marine. The focus will be on animal recognition, general characteristics and behavior through animal observations, Observations will be made of live animals in Americas Teaching Zoo as well as on video. Additional species will be presented in photographic slides. Applies to Association Degree. Transfer credit:

Wildlife Conservation

RECOMMENDED PREPARATION: ANSC M07

3.00 Units

Topics will include awareness and appreciation of wildlife, human values and wildlife, wildlife conservation, cultural and social interaction with wildlife, wildlife issues and responsible human actions. Primate Behavior Lab

1.00 Unit

Observation and analysis of primate behavior at America's Teaching Zoo. Activities include the application and evaluation of operant conditioning and environmental enrichment techniques specific to primates. May be taken two (2) times for credit. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer Credit: determined by transfer institution.

ANTH M01

Biological Anthropology

3.00 Units

Provides hands-on understanding of principles of evolution and genetics. Covers comparative vertebrate anatomy, modern and fossil hominids, primatology, variation in modern human populations, medical genetics and adaptability. Introduces molecular biological methods. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU, UC. IGETC AREA 5B

Cultural Anthropology

3.00 Units

Focuses on basic concepts and methods for analyzing cultural systems, illustrated with examples drawn largely from non-Western societies. Emphasis will be on the structure and evolution of human behavior in all major aspects of culture. Provider approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing. Provider number CEP2811 for 45 contact hours. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU; UC. IGETC AREA

3.00 Units

A study of the major principles and techniques used to create visual art objects in diverse media, this course helps students to develop informed perceptions and evaluations of works of art to understand them in their historical and cultural contexts. (Formerly ART M02) Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU; UC. IGETC AREA 3A

ART M11 History of Art: Prehistoric through Gothic 3.00 Units

The history of art from prehistoric times through the middle ages, ranging from ancient to Gothic art, with an emphasis on the Western world. Examines key styles and movements in hart history and introduces techniques for producing art. This course is required for art majors. (Formerly ART M01A) Applies to Associate Degree. History of Art: Renaissance through Modern

3.00 Units

The history of art from the early Renaissance to modern times with an emphasis on the Western world. Woven throughout the course are the implications of the science of biology on human affairs. Majors in biology, health science (pre-nursing), or related areas enroll in BIOL M02A. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU; UC (no credit if taken after BIOL M02A) IGETC AREA 5B.

BIOL MO2A General Biology I _______5.00 Units

PREREQUISITES: MATH M03 or 2 years of high school algebra or equivalent and CHEM M01A or CHEM M12 or high school chemistry all with a grade of C or better

First semester of general biology for majors. Introduces students to major biological themes and principles that are fundamental to an understanding of life processes in any field of biology today. Topics covered include the scientific process, biological chemistry, cellular biology, metabolism, life cycles, genetics, molecular biology, DNA technology, developmental genetics, and evolutionary processes. Does not apply toward a degree.

LS M09 Strategies for Personal Success

3.00 Units

Develops personal management skills in a small group setting. Explores issues relevant to the disabled population, such as coping with disabilities, learning advocacy techniques, building interpersonal skills through acquiring appropriate communication techniques, developing strategies for setting and following through on goals, time management, wellness issues and career exploration. Stress management, assertiveness training and risk taking skills are emphasized. May be taken two (2) times for credit. Does not apply toward a degree.

Memory Improvement Strategies

Introduces a variety of memory techniques and strategies to improve the ability to organize and remember information for school and general life activities. May be taken two (2) times for credit. Does not apply to a degree.

Strategies for Positive Self Esteem

3.00 Units

Introduces a ten-step model designed to help students become self-empowered individuals with positive self-esteem. Topics include: letting go of negative past experiences; developing appreciation of self and others; clarifying purpose and vision; setting new goals and objectives; visualization; affirmations; finding success in college, the workplace, the home environment, and in interpersonal relationships; maintaining self-esteem. Does not apply toward a degree.

LS M14 Computer and Tutorial Instruction 0.50 to 1.50 Units

Provides students with the opportunity to develop academic skills through the use of computer-based or small group instruction. Individualized, self-paced instruction is determined by student 's identified learning needs. Areas of instruction may include assistive technology training, computer skills development, reading, writing, mathematics, job skills, and study strategies. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only. SPEECH

SPCH M01

Introduction to Speech

3.00 Units

Designed to prepare students to be effective oral communicators in a public speaking context through instruction in basck communication theory, appropriate delivery skills, common organizational patterns, and thorough research techniques. Also offers practical training in feedback and listening skills. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU; UC (IGETC AREA 1C, CSU only). CAN: SPCH 4

SPCH M03

Voice and Diction

3.00 Units Introduces theory and practice of voice control, emphasizing correct pronunciation, breathing control techniques, and regional and foreign dialects. Especially useful for those in theatre, forensics and broadcasting. May be taken two (2) times for credit. (Same course as RT M08 and THA M03) Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU; UC. CAN: DRAM 6

Interpersonal Communication

Provides an introduction to the dynamics of communication in one-to-one relationships, focusing on experience, behavior, and rules governing interpersonal contexts such as friendship, families, and employer-employee relations. Factors influencing communication are studied such as language, perception, non-verbal cues, listening, status and roles. Problems of communication are identified and explored through conflict resolution and problem solving techniques. Assertiveness and confidence in relating interpersonally through the communication process are studied. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU; UC. CAN: SPCH 8

SPCH M07

Argumentation and Debate

3.00 Units

Introduces theory, methodology, and practice of critical listening, critical thinking and oral argument, including training in propositions, methods of analysis, stock issue policy analysis, evidence and proof, and cross-examination considerations. Examines types of debatable propositions, effective listening and note taking, research methodology, and delivery skills. Practices team and Lincoln/Douglas formats on class-selected topics and issues. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU; UC. CAN: SPCH 6

SPCH M10A/B/C/D Forensics

2.00 Units

Provides training, rehearsal, practice and performance necessary to succeed as a competitive speech team. Emphasizes argumentation and debate, informative and persuasive speaking, and impromptu and extemporaneous speaking. Involves research and one-on-one interactive training. Requires participation in interscholastic competition or community speaker 's bureau. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU

SPCH M25

Introduction to Rhetorical Criticism

3.00 Units

PREREQUISITES:ENGL M01A

Studies the principles of reasoning and rhetoric and their application to the analysis and evaluation of public discourse. Examines both the technique and the substance of discourse by exploring rhetorical strategies, quality of argument, quality of support for claims, use of language, fallacies, as well as the demands placed on the speaker by the audience. Emphasizes the integration of critical thinking principles with techniques of effective written and spoken discourse.

Rhetoric of Popular Culture

RECOMMENDED PREPARATION: ENGL M01A Studies U.S. popular culture. Examines the role of popular culture in the U.S. as a mediator of cultural values and attitudes. Specifically evaluates popular cultural in advertising, film, television, sports, and politics. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU: UC. IGETC AREA 3B

WORK EXPERIENCE

WEXP M10 General Work Experience

1.00 to 6.00 Units

Provides on-the-job learning to develop effective work habits, attitudes, and career awareness in paid or unpaid jobs that need not be related to student 's major or career goals. Both workplace supervisor and faculty advisor provide feedback and/or written evaluations. Requires orientation session, consultations with faculty supervisor, learning objectives that demonstrate new or expanded learning, and term paper or project. TITLE V Regulations: 1) Under the Parallel Plan the student must be taking a minimum of 7 units, which can include the work experience units, and can enroll in 1-3.00 Units per semester; 2) Under the Alternate Plan the student must enroll in no more than one other course and can enroll in up to 6 units for one semester; and 3) The student can earn a maximum of 6 units of General Work Experience. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only. May be taken four (4) times for credit or until a total of 16-work experience units are earned. Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer credit: CSU

WEXP M20 Occupational Work Experience (Internship)

1.00 to 8.00 Units

Corequisites: Enrollment in at least 7 college units, inclusive of this course

Provides on-the-job learning related to a career interest or major, under the direct supervision of faculty and industry supervisors. Both supervisors provide feedback and written evaluations. Requires attending an orientation, developing three evaluated learning objectives, writing a summary report, and maintaining signed verification of worked hours. Also requires meeting at least twice with faculty advisor, who visits the work site, supervises the occupational work experience, and awards a grade. Requires 60 hours unpaid work or 75 hours paid work for each unit earned. May be taken a maximum of 4 times, not to exceed 16 units in combination with any other work experience/internship courses. WEXP M31 Job and Career Readiness

0.50 Unit

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

OPEN TO ENROLLMENT

Each course offered by the Ventura County Community College District and its colleges is open to enrollment and participation by any person who has been admitted to the college and who meets the prerequisites to the class or program, unless specifically exempted by statute.

HOW TO APPLY

New students: If you have never attended Moorpark College, an application for admission is required in order to register for classes. You are eligible to attend Moorpark College if you have graduated from high school or are 18 years of age. You may also be eligible to attend as a Special Admission student if you are still enrolled in high school.

New students and new Special Admission students are encouraged to apply on-line at www.moorparkcollege.edu/apply. New students may also apply by mail, fax, or in person.

Returning Students: If you last attended Moorpark College prior to Spring 2003, you are not required to re-apply for admission. However, to be eligible to register during New & Returning student priority registration beginning April 28th, returning students must contact the Registration & Records Office no later than April 18th to update their enrollment status.

Returning students may make changes to their e-mail address, phone number, or address on-line at www.moorparkcollege.edu/webstar. If your name has changed since you last attended, please visit the Records Office to make the change.

HOW TO REGISTER

HOW TO DETERMINE WHEN TO REGISTER

Continuing Students: If you attended Moorpark, Oxnard, or Ventura College in Spring 2008 or Fall 2007, you are a continuing student and are entitled to priority registration beginning April 14th. Starting April 1st, continuing students may log onto www.moorparkcollege.edu/webstar to view their priority registration date.

Priority for continuing students is based on the number of units completed within the Ventura County Community College District. Students with the highest number of units are assigned the earliest registration dates. Units from other institutions are not included for purposes of determining registration priority.

New & Returning Students: If you have never attended Moorpark, Oxnard, or Ventura College you are a new student. If you last attended any of these colleges before Fall 2007, you are a returning student.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

New students who apply by April 18th and returning students who update their enrollment status with the Office of Registration & Records by April 18th, are eligible to register beginning April 28th.

New and returning students who do not meet the November 18th deadline may register beginning May 5th. No appointment is needed.

Instructional Materials Fee: Instructional material fees for certain selected credit or noncredit courses may be required at the time of registration, or the materials may be purchased on your own. If an Instructional Material Fee is required, the amount of the fee is listed beneath the course title in the schedule of classes. Authority for the charge is granted under Ventura County Community College District Board Policy 5030. These instructional and other materials include but are not limited to text books, tools, equipment and clothing if:

- 1. The instructional and other materials required for the course have a continuing value to the student outside of the classroom setting, or
- The instructional and other materials are used in the production of an end product that has continuing value to the student outside the classroom setting. See course schedule for instructional material fee costs.

Nonresident Tuition for Non-California Residents - Summer 2008 - \$175.00, Fall 2008 - \$181,00. If you are a nonresident student, you are required to pay the mandatory enrollment and health fees in addition to nonresident tuition.

Foreign Student Capital Outlay Surcharge: \$14.00 per unit. Students are required to pay the mandatory enrollment, nonresident tuition, and health fees in addition to the foreign student capital outlay surcharge unless they meet one of the exemptions listed below pursuant to Ed Code #76142. Application Fee (International Students): The Ventura County Community College District has adopted a non-refundable \$50.00 fee to apply for admission to Moorpark College. This fee covers the cost of federally-mandated documentation. Students are required to pay the fee unless they meet one of the exemptions listed below pursuant to Ed code #76142.

• Students must demonstrate economic hardship. • Be a victim of persecution in the country in which the student is a resident.

College Photo I.D./Associated Students (Optional): \$10.00 per semester fee, \$15.00 per year. Card holders receive reduced cost attendance at college events, discounts for certain theater tickets and other commercial businesses.

Student Center Fee: \$1.00 per credit unit, Maximum \$10.00 per year - Students receiving benefits under CalWorks, SSI/SSP, or General Assistance may be exempt from this fee. Contact the Financial Aid Office for further information.

Student Representation Fee: \$1.00. The fee funds student representatives who state positions and viewpoints before city, county and district governments, and before offices and agencies of the state and federal government. Authorized by Education Code Section #76060.5. May be waived for religious, political, financial, or moral reasons. Contact the Associated Students Office at (805) 378-1400, ext. 1635.

Refunds/Credits: (Enrollment fees will be refunded minus a \$10 Administration Fee.) In order to qualify for a refund or credit, a student must officially drop a class or withdraw from school by the appropriate refund deadline using one of the 4 methods described on page 151. The refund deadline for semester-length courses for the Fall 2008 semester is August 29, 2008. Short-term classes have different refund deadlines that are specific to each class. These deadline dates are available on-line at www.moorparkcollege.edu/schedule.

Students who officially drop classes by the appropriate refund deadline will have their Moorpark College account credited and may then request a refund by the original payment method, or use the credited amount toward future registration fees. Students who are dropped for nonattendance after the Refund/ Credit deadline, you will be responsible for all fees owed. Refund request forms are available in the Student Business Office.**PLEASE NOTE:** Your parking sticker must be turned in to receive a parking refund. Nonresident tuition and the Foreign Student Capital Outlay Surcharge refund are based on the following: For classes lasting the full semester: Week 1 and 2 - 100% refund; Week 3 and 4 - 50% refund. For classes shorter than the full semester: 10% of class meetings - 100% refund; 20% of class meetings -50% refund.

Interested students should "apply now." A Financial Aid application is available on-line at www.fafsa.ed.gov or you may pick up a copy at the Financial Aid Office. Don't delay in applying. The process may take up to three months. Financial aid will be awarded to eliqible students subject to availability of funds.

Officials for Fee Walver

You are eligible to receive a fee waiver if you are a California resident and you meet any ONE of the following criteria:

- 1. Are currently receiving benefits from TANF/CalWORKs, SSI/SSP or General Assistance.
- 2. Are a dependent student whose parent(s) are currently receiving TANF/CalWORKs or SSI/SSP.
- 3. Meet certain income standards (income standards available in the Financial Aid).

If you do not meet any of the criteria, you may still qualify for a waiver if you:

4. Have completed the FAFSA at Moorpark College and have demonstrated eligibility for a Board of Governor's Fee Waiver.

You must complete a BOGW application. Contact the Financial Aid Office or go on-line to apply at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Fee waivers are valid for the entire academic year starting Fall-Spring and ending Summer.

FIRST STEP -Think FAFSA...Before you can receive any financial aid, you must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on-line at: **www.FAFSA.ed.gov**

TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE THROUGH FAFSA

• Pell Grants (from \$400 to \$4,731 per year)

The Federal Pell Grant is free money for college and does not have to be repaid. It is offered to undergraduate students who meet financial need criteria. When you file the FAFSA form, the government determines what you and your family can afford to pay for college. They call this your Family Contribution. If your family qualifies (has a family income under a set amount per year), the Pell grant provides a "foundation" for your financial aid. The maximum amount of a Federal Pell Grant is adjusted annually to correlate with funding, so it varies from year to year. Pell Grants awards range from \$400 to \$4,731 a year.

• Community College Fee Waiver

The California Community College Board of Governors* Enrollment Fee Waiver, or BOG Fee Waiver, waives the enrollment fees at the California Community Colleges for students who are eligible for need-based financial aid, receive CalWORKs/TANF, SSI or General Assistance payments or whose family income falls below the ceilings. Student must be a California resident.

• SEOG Grants (from \$100 to \$4,000 per year)

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (FSEOG) are federal grants. Colleges award between \$100 and \$4,000 per year to undergraduate students with exceptional financial needs. Priority is given to Pell Grant recipients

• Cal Grants (from \$576 to \$1551 per year)

California offers Cal Grants for undergraduate students who meet the financial, academic and eligibility requirements and apply on time. The award for most first-year Cal Grant B students is \$1,551 and for Cal Grant C students is \$576, and may be used for books, living expenses, and transportation, as well as tuition and fees. Students must complete the FAFSA and Cal Grant GPA verification form by September 2, 2008.

Student Loans

Federal Stafford Loans are for eligible students. There are two types: subsidized, for which the government pays the interest while students are in school; and unsubsidized, for which students are responsible for paying all the interest. Students can receive both types of loans at the same time.

Parent Loans

Federal Plus Loans help parents and stepparents pay their dependent's college costs. To apply, parents must complete a AND loan application and pass a credit check, and students must file the FAFSA.

Work Study

The Work Study Program lets eligible students earn money through a job on campus to help defray college costs.

Remember the First Step... Cal Grant deadline is March 2, 2008 (pertains to 2008-09 academic year and requires GPA verification form and FAFSA). Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on-line at: **www.FAFSA.ed.gov**

HELPFUL HINTS

- Apply early in order to have the best chance for all available funds (Cal Grant deadline is March 2, 2008).
- · Answer all questions on the application unless instructed to skip.
- \bullet Remember the student and/or parent signatures on the application.
- · Keep a copy of your application for your records.
- When you file your tax return (1040, 1040EZ, etc.) remember to keep a copy.
- You must submit copies of all documents requested. (The Financial Aid Office will not duplicate or return original documents submitted.)
- Promptly respond to all requests form the Financial Aid Office. Incomplete files will delay your award processing.
- If you transfer within the VCCCD (Moorpark, Oxnard, Ventura) during the 2008 school year, your aid may be revised and/or delayed.
- In order to receive financial aid, you must be enrolled and attending the college that offers you aid.
