Certification and Double Counting

Executive Order (E.O.) No. 167 delegates to the California Community Colleges the authority to identify baccalaureate courses applicable to the CSU Executive Order No. 1033 authorizes the California Community Colleges to designate courses that fulfill the General Education-Breath requirements. Since 1982, community colleges also have been authorized to designate, using the provisions of E.O. no. 405, community college courses that fulfill the U.S. history, constitution and American ideals requirement. Although graduation requirements vary among CSU campuses, community colleges can ensure maximum compatibility between community college courses and CSU lower division requirements through utilization of the certification process.

Most CSU campuses allow double counting for general education and major requirements to applicants who submit either full or partial certification. Exceptions are indicated below.

Bakersfield - Courses can be dbl. counted if articulated; Channel Islands - Some dbl. counting is permitted; Chico - Dbl. counting is generally not permitted for students in a special major; Dominguez Hills - Dbl. counting is permitted in certain majors; Fresno - Dbl. counting is subject to departmental approval. A maximum of two courses may be dbl. counted for most majors; Fullerton - Dbl. counting is permitted, except in Business Administration & Communications: Humbolt - Some dbl. counting is permitted: Long Beach - allows a total of 10 units in major and GE to overlap for students not fully certified; Los Angeles - courses can be double counted if articulated; Monterey Bay - Dbl. counting is subject to departmental approval; Northridge - Limited dbl. counting is permitted in specific majors; Sacramento - Dbl. counting is limited to nine (9) units in major subject area; San Bernardino- Dbl. counting is permitted except for philosophy and communication majors; San Francisco - Total of 12 units in major and GE to overlap in either upper or lower division; San Jose - Courses can be double counted if articulated. Otherwise, subject to department approval; San Luis Obispo - Some dbl. counting is permitted: San Marcos - Some dbl. counting not permitted in upper division GE. See catalog for addt'l department-specific information: **Sonoma -** Some dbl. counting is permitted.

All campuses allow double counting of courses taken to meet General Education-Breadth and the American Institutions requirement for applicants who are either fully or partially certified.


ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE CSU SYSTEM AS AN UPPER DIVISION TRANSFER STUDENT

A prospective upper-division transfer student must complete 60 transferable semester units (90 quarter units) with a minimum grade point average of 2.0 (2.4 for nonresidents). Within the 60 units, a minimum of 30 semester units (45 quarter units) that meet general education requirements must be completed with a grade of C or better in each course. The 30 semester units must include at least 9 semester (12 quarter) units (three courses) in the English Language and Critical Thinking (written communication, oral communication, and critical thinking) and at least 3 semester units (4 quarter units) in mathematics/quantitative reasoning.

Transfer students may transfer a maximum of 70 semester units to the CSU. If a student has more than 70 units, students may receive subject credit.

Students who were eligible to attend CSU at the time of high school graduation may transfer with less than 60 semester units provided they maintain a C average (2.0 GPA at Moorpark College), are in good standing, and the CSU campus is accepting lower division transfers (consult with individual campuses for specific information). Eligibility is determined by high school grade point average, either SAT or ACT scores, and required course work. Students ineligible for admission from high school to the CSU should complete the requirements for an upper division transfer student as stated above. Students must satisfy high school deficiencies prior to transfer by completing with a C or better one of the following: 1) 1987 or earlier high school graduates: Complete 9 units in Area A & 3-4 units of math in Area B. However, it is advised that students complete a minimum of 60 transferable semester units and have a GPA of 2.0 or better in all transferable units attempted. In addition, it is advised that students complete at least 30 semester units of college courses applicable to CSU general education pattern. 2) 1988 and after graduates: complete 30 units applicable to CSU general education pattern, including Areas A and B.4 requirements listed on the next page.

CSU CERTIFICATION: General Education "Certification" means that Moorpark College has verified that a transfer student has completed the lower division General Education requirements for the California State University. This is important because the requirements differ slightly from campus to campus. Once "certified", the CSU campus of choice will know that the student has completed requirements as articulated between the CSU and Moorpark College (9 units of upper division General Education courses must be completed after transfer). Courses from other schools may be considered by catalogue evaluation. Please see a Moorpark Counselor for assistance. It is the student's responsibility to request "certification".
