Facilitator: Dr. Matthew Oaks, Professor English at Rock Valley College and National Faculty Member of CAST

This 75-minute virtual session will introduce educators to Universal Design for Learning (UDL) -a research-based educational framework that improves engagement and learning outcomes for all learners by focusing on building flexibility into the curriculum from the outset in order to avoid time-consuming retrofitting after the fact. Increasingly, diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) efforts are considering accessibility as a core component of achieving more equitable outcomes by creating more inclusive learning and working environments that work for everyone. Some have even started to refer to these efforts as DEI and A initiatives. We at CAST applaud these efforts, as accessibility is also a foundational component of Universal Design for Learning, UDL builds on accessibility to create environments where the variability and diversity of all learners is celebrated and supported through flexible designs that reduce barriers and empower all learners to achieve their full potential. Participants will identify ways their current DEI practices align with UDL strategies and learn tangible methods they can apply to their classroom and/or work immediately in order to support more inclusive DEI and A practices.

MATHEW OAKES, PHD

Professor English at Rock Valley College and National Faculty Member of CAST

Dr. Mathew Oakes (he/him/his) is a Professor of English at Rock Valley College and a National Faculty member at CAST. Matt has worked in higher education since 2005 and in the community college system since 2010. His focus is on equitable curriculum development, teaching practices, and institutional policy and practice.

Most recently, Matt has chaired Rock Valley College's institutional diversity, equity, and inclusion committee, mentored other faculty and staff in UDL, presented nationally on the intersection of DEI and UDL, and leads his department's effort to use disaggregated student success data to inform curricular and policy practices.

The Rockford Register Star named Matt a Person to Watch in 2018 and a Future Leader of the Rock River Valley in 2019. A regular nominee for Rock Valley College' Faculty Member of the Year award, Matt was awarded the college's inaugural EAGLE Award of Excellence in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion - Faculty in 2022.

Matt is an alumnus of the University of Toronto, the University of British Columbia, and the University of Illinois at Chicago.

Matt is also a Registered Yoga Teacher (RYT-200) and teachers restorative, community-based yoga and meditation.
