1. Call to Order, Public Comments, Approval of 10/10/17 Minutes	Public comments: Jerry Mansfield stated that the CurricUNET contract will be ending in February. The plan is to adopt another curriculum management system, possibly Course Leaf. The content in the current system will be migrated to the new system. The labels in CurricUNET will not be changed, because the contract ends in February and the new system will be in place by fall 2018. CurricUNET is not being considered, because the college has not been happy with past support. Training on the system would need to occur regardless of the system chosen, since the CurricUNET upgrade has different features.

SLO Coordinator Report</p>	<p>Highlights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Met with all disciplines that had calendared meetings for this semester. • Focus on Arts and Humanities’ current GLOs and assessments. • Suggest creating a common rubric between the two divisions of Arts and Humanities. • Met with John and he agrees a common rubric is possible for Arts and Humanities and requests templates for this rubric. Ryan wants to make sure to streamline this rubric. • Invited Mary Rees to the Nov. 30th GLO meeting to give a history of GLOs and Katie Booth will also present • Six Biological Sciences faculty attended the tabletop session and they want to change how they assess and create a study guide. • Met with Roger Putnam from Geology who shared that their CLOs are outdated and would like to change the CLO to focus on, “The Nine Big Ideas of Earth Science.” • Met with Mary Mills from CIS who has new courses to submit for state approval. These course do not have CLOs and it was recommended that CLOs be created as soon as possible and not wait after state approval. <p>ACTION: Mahta will have a meeting with Biotechnology on Nov. 16th. She will be with Katie also on Nov. 16th to plan for the Nov. 30th GLO meeting.</p>
<p>3. Equity in the Classroom Project presentation – Farisa Morales</p>	<p>Farisa from Physics and Astronomy presented the concepts learned at the Student Success Conference and provided a handout on “Step Up and Lead for Equity.” She shared that after the conference, a core group of faculty were given access to their own faculty level data and started the “Equity in the Classroom Project.” Farisa mentioned that she is more aware of how her ethnic cultural background influences her interactions with students and have made adjustments in her approach toward students to help them better engage in class. She briefly showed a graphic representation of Vincent’s chemistry class results (had received Vincent’s permission).</p> <p>ACTION: Invite Farisa back in spring along with Vincent to share their equity in the classroom findings.</p>

<p>5. Discussion of Document Repository and its use</p>	<p>Members agreed to have the Document Repository available on the SLO Committee website.</p>

6. Other items of interest and/or concern	Susan from the Arts asked, what the difference is between outcomes and objectives. It was shared that CurricUNET automatically populates the outcome section with objectives, until it is changed manually, which adds to the confusion. Dani added that the objectives on the COR are the nuts & bolts of the course. An outcome can be a test to assess whether the students know _____ concepts. CLOs are two or three things the students need to know or do; an overarching theme of the course.
