CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS 1984-85

California law empowers Moorpark College to certify to all campuses of CSU that a maximum of 39 lower division units required for General Education for a baccalaureate degree have been completed. The required pattern of course work is as follows: A. Communication and Critical Thinking, 9 units; B. Natural Sciences, 9 units; C. Humanities, 9 units; D. Social, Political and Economic Institutions, 9 units; E. Lifelong Understanding and Self Development, 3 units.

PLEASE NOTE:

WARNING — The courses and requirements hereon are subject to change.

COMPLETE CERTIFICATION — Completion of all five sections of these requirements prior to transferring will certify to each of the 19 schools on this map that you have fulfilled the basic 39 unit minimum lower division requirement in General Education prior to transferring. (9-13 units of upper division general education work will need to be completed after transfer.)

PARTIAL CERTIFICATION — It is possible to complete separately any of the areas of sections (A-E) at Moorpark College and receive partial certification in each of those areas; it will be necessary for you to complete the remaining areas after transferring, as defined by the catalog of the transfer school.

U.S. HISTORY, CONSTITUTION AND AMERICAN IDEALS REQUIREMENTS — All campuses require at least one U.S. history and one political science course to satisfy this requirement (often in addition to GE requirements). Courses approved to satisfy this requirement are underlined within Area D.

CERTIFIED COURSES — Moorpark College will certify courses completed at Ventura and Oxnard Colleges in partial satisfaction of GE requirements provided that such courses are baccalaureate level and would be certified by the institution offering them. Students who have completed college courses at schools outside this



> USE OF MAJOR COURSES — Courses taken in the department of a student's major generally may not be used to fulfill GE requirements.

> ADMISSION — Moorpark College students who are planning to transfer to one of the campuses of the California State University System can qualify for admissions by meeting the following requirements:

freshmen and have maintained a "C" average or better in all transferable college units attempted, or 2.) were eligible as freshmen except for the high school subject requirements in English and mathematics (four years of college preparatory English and two years of college preparatory mathematics) and have satisfied any deficiencies by equivalent college course work, and have maintained a "C" average or better in all transferable college units attempted, or 3.) were not eligible as freshmen, have

completed at least 56 transferable semester units with at least a "C" average and have satisfied any high school subject deficiencies in English and mathematics by equivalent college course work. NOTE — See a counselor for information regarding removal of high school subject deficiencies. Effective Fall 1986 transfer applicants must meet subject requirements regardless of the date of high school graduation.
