DUAL ENROLLMENT

Moorpark College's Dual Enrollment Program provides K12 students the opportunity to earn college credits before graduating high school to expand college and career readiness. Unlike AP courses that serve honors students, often those with college already on their horizon, dual enrollment brings college to students who would not have previously considered attending. Our College and Career Access Pathway courses (CCAP) help students learn that college is for them; and builds a pipeline to Moorpark College where they can later matriculate and complete programs that lead to high-wage jobs.

The average units/credits taken by MC Dual Enrollment students is **4.01** with an average overall GPA of **3.35**. In the 2024-2025 academic year, **nearly 6%** of dual enrollment participants identified as first-generation college students.

GROWTH, STUDENT ENROLLMENT, & SUCCESS

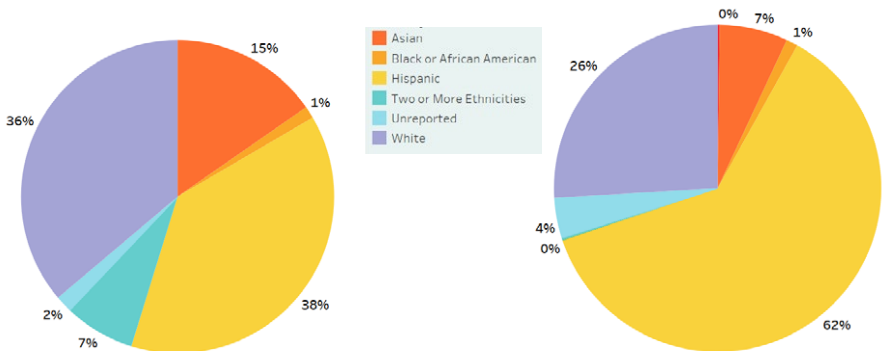
In the 2019-2020 school year, Moorpark College’s Dual Enrollment Program served 1,964 K-12 students with an 87.1% course success rate. Now, in the 2024-25 school year, 3,625 students participated in dual enrollment courses through Moorpark College with an 89.5% success rate. In the 2019-2020 academic year, 8 certificates and degrees were awarded to dual enrollment students. In the 2024-2025 academic year, 41 certificates and degrees were awarded to dual enrollment students. In fall 2020, 325 of the students engaged in dual enrollment in the 2019-20 academic year matriculated to Moorpark College and in fall 2025, 438 of the dually enrolled students in the 2024-2025 academic year matriculated to Moorpark College.

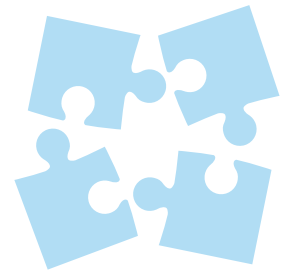

We are committed to creating College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) with our K-12 partners to develop seamless pathways from high school to Moorpark College. With an equity lens, we aim to create a culture for students who may not have thought of themselves as college graduates while meeting the Vision 2030 goal of ensuring high school students graduate with 12 units of college credit. As a way to close equity gaps, changing more of the non-CCAP courses to CCAP will ensure that disproportionately impacted students, who are low-income, can afford to enroll in courses, as CCAP allows dual enrollment students to have their college fees and textbooks paid for.

GOAL: Establish on-ground pathways at partner high schools that enable students to earn 12+ college units before graduation and transition seamlessly to MC to complete a certificate or associate degree.

GOAL: Implement dualenroll.com to streamline registration, improve data tracking, and strengthen coordination with high school partners and campus departments.

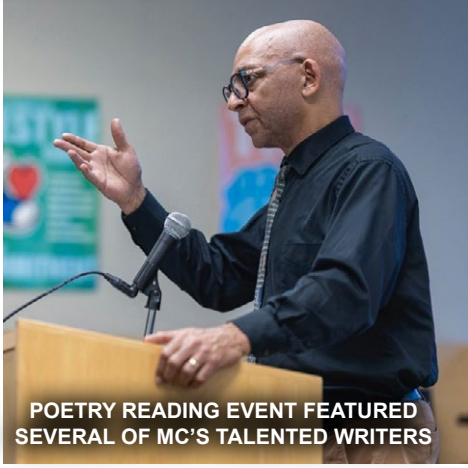
