- A new 4-week Career Launch cycle scheduled for July.



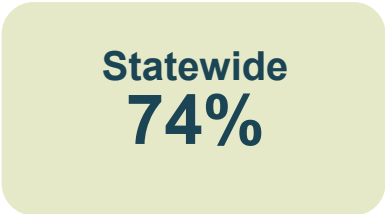
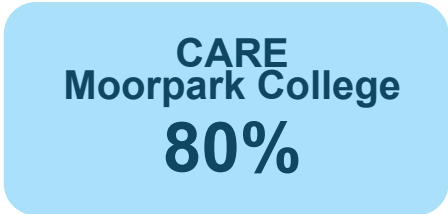


CARE

At Moorpark College, the **CalWORKs program partners with the Counties of Ventura and Los Angeles** to support eligible students in pursuing their educational degrees and certificates. The program also emphasizes career preparation by providing opportunities to gain work experience, equipping students with the skills and pathways needed to achieve long-term economic mobility and secure family-sustaining employment.

ACCESS

Accessibility Coordination Center and Educational Support Services (ACCESS) supports students with verified disabilities by determining and providing reasonable accommodations, auxiliary aids, and support services.

Over 12% of the MC student population are registered with ACCESS

ACCESS Student Utilization has increased 22% over the last three years. Based on Fall 2025 data, we're expected to have another increase in student head count this year. As DSPS funding is based on student head count, our positive increase in student utilization numbers will also positively increase our future funding.

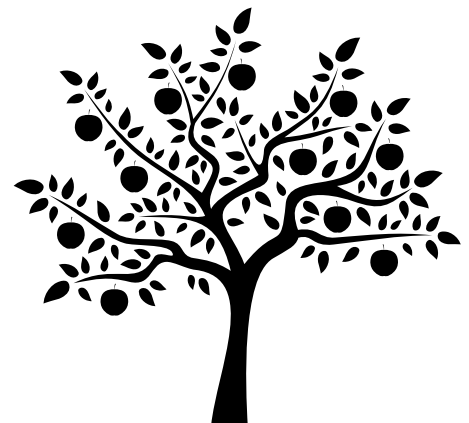
ADDITIONAL HIGHLIGHTS
