 5. Standards & Policies regarding Student Preparation and Success
 6. College governance structures, as related to faculty roles
 7. Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation process
 8. Policies for faculty professional development activities
 9. Processes for program review
 10. Processes for institutional planning and budget development
- + Other academic and professional matters as mutually agreed upon.

The initial list of proposed resolutions to go to the state Academic Senate Plenary in November has been released; now is the time for discussion before they are finalized ready for voting by all colleges in the state.
