New Business	 Equity Programs (Research and Evaluation) Pam's sabbatical was prompted by the Equity Plan and triggered an interest to research successful equity-based programs. This included First Year Experience (FYE), summer bridges, counseling best practices, and especially placed an emphasis on programs backed with research for student success Pam visited UC Santa Barbara-EOP and EAOP programs, CSU Channel Islands-PATH Program, CSU Northridge-EOP and Resilient Scholars program, El Camino CC-FYE program, Santa Barbara CC-Express to Success, LA Pierce-Outreach and FYE programs, Pasadena CC-Pathways. Highlights included: SBCC's Express to Success (1 semester of learning community including Math and English) LA Pierce Outreach Program (1 Coordinator and 11 interns that provide specific outreach visits to feeder HS, with assessment and abbreviated ed plans by counselors on site.
