Things to bring to/consider for your registration appointment	More Information	✓
The results of your completed Moorpark College <u>Self-Placement Guides</u> for Math and English	This will allow us to help you register for classes that are most suited to your present skill levels	
Your most recent IEP	With original documentation of disability/psycho-educational testing report	
If your diagnosis is a Learning Disability , bring the scores of your most recent assessment results	We need the <u>raw scores</u> (not just the Standard Scores and Percentile Ranks) for <u>both</u> the cognitive tests and the achievement tests. Often these scores are kept at your school's district office instead of your high school site	
If your diagnosis is <u>medical</u> or <u>psychological</u> (ADD, ADHD, clinical depression, bipolar disorder, etc.)	Bring a signed statement from your doctor, on letterhead, stating your exact diagnosis and a list of any prescribed medications and their recommended dosages	
If you are under 18	Bring a statement signed by your parent or guardian that you have their permission to register at Moorpark College	
Your goals for attending Moorpark College	For example, an AA degree, transfer to a four-year college, a vocational certificate of completion, exploring your options, etc.	
Ideas for classes you would like to take and the days and times you would like to schedule	Look at the catalog to learn about the classes. Look at the schedule to find out the days and times for each semester
