Guided Pathways

**What is the framework?
How will it affect my work?**

Cafeteria Model

Academic Program Structure:

- Unclear pathway with unlimited options
- Unpredictable scheduling
- Curriculum not always intentionally or comprehensively aligned

New Student Intake:

- Often optional
- Emphasis on self-exploration
- Assessment testing for placement
- Optional guidance/intrusive suggestions

Instruction- Student Learning:

- Learning outcomes focus on courses
- Instructors independent contractors
- Student metacognitive skills outside of discipline scope

Progress - Keeping Students on Track:

- Not coordinated for most students
- Little intrusive support
- Academic departments disconnected from counseling and student tracking

Guided Pathways Model

Academic Program Structure:

- Clear program pathway easily identifiable by students
- Program mapped to outcomes
- Alignment between departments and disciplines
- Predictable scheduling and availability

New Student Intake:

- Required academic plans (comprehensive & brief)
- Multi-tool meta-majors
- Diagnostic assessment and multiple measures placement
- Basic skills, contextualized real-world applications

Instruction-Student Learning:

- Faculty collaborate to define/assess learning outcomes for programs
- Faculty trained and supported, metacognition explicit instructional goal

Progress - Keeping Students on Track:

- Students closely monitored for progress
- Early warning systems in place coupled with timely interventions
- Advisors and program faculty work closely

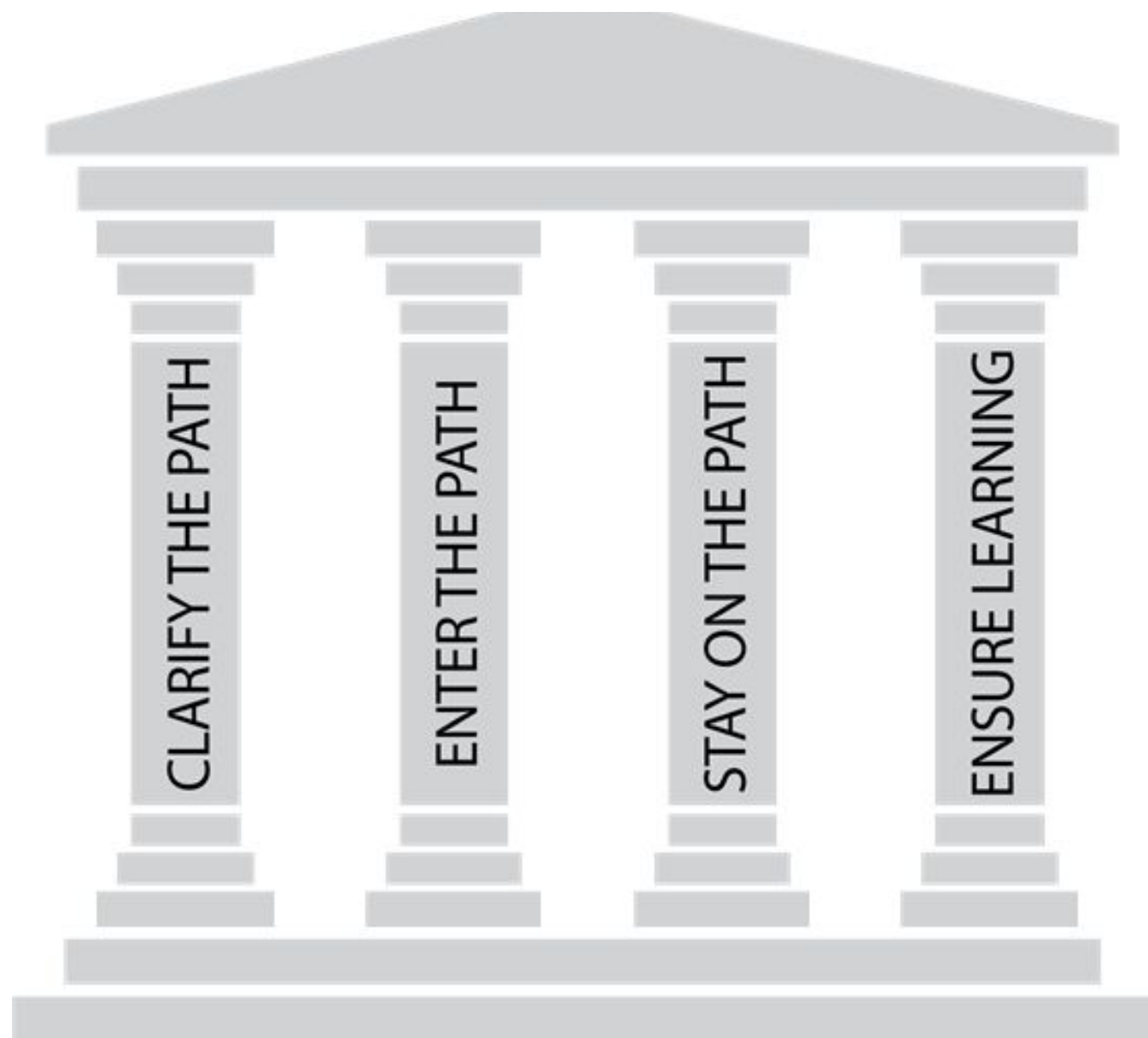

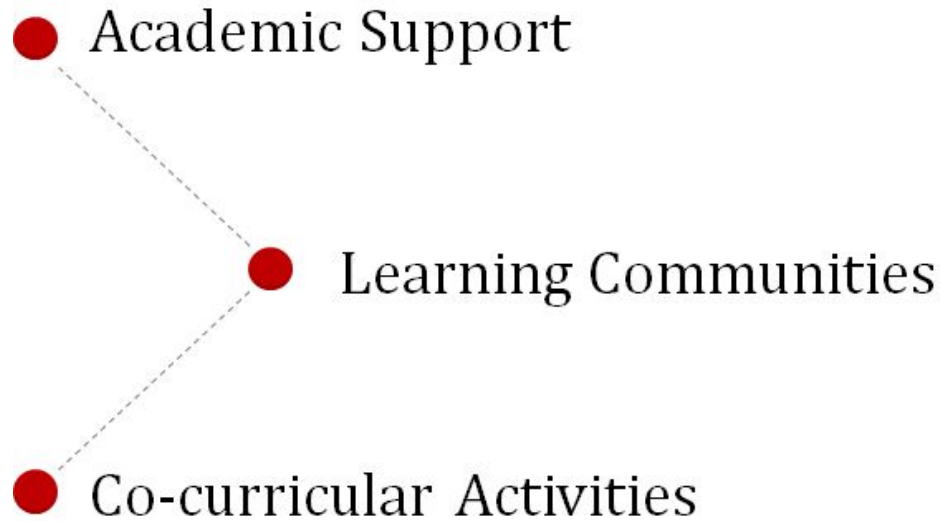

BC'S GUIDED PATHWAYS KEY TERMS

| | |
|--------------------------------------|--|
| Completion Coaching Community | A cross-functional team of faculty, staff, and administrators responsible for oversight and engagement of a particular group of students during a period of time. The individuals in the group have at least one statistical factor – such as meta-major of study – in common. Each team member is called a “Completion Coach.” |
| Meta-major | A collection of academic programs that have common or related content. Programs within a meta-major will share some common requirements to allow for early exploration as students may enroll in this broad field of interest without collecting excess units. |
| Program of Study | A set of courses and related activities that lead to an attainment of educational objectives such as a certificate or an associate’s degree; often referred to as a major of study. |
| Pathway | A descriptive and easy-to-use plan detailing the scope and sequence of courses required to complete a credential efficiently and transition to baccalaureate degree programs or the labor market. Includes the route a student takes to connect with, enter, progress through, and complete his/her program of study, as well as, the skills they need to acquire for the labor market they will enter after their certificate or associate or baccalaureate degree. |

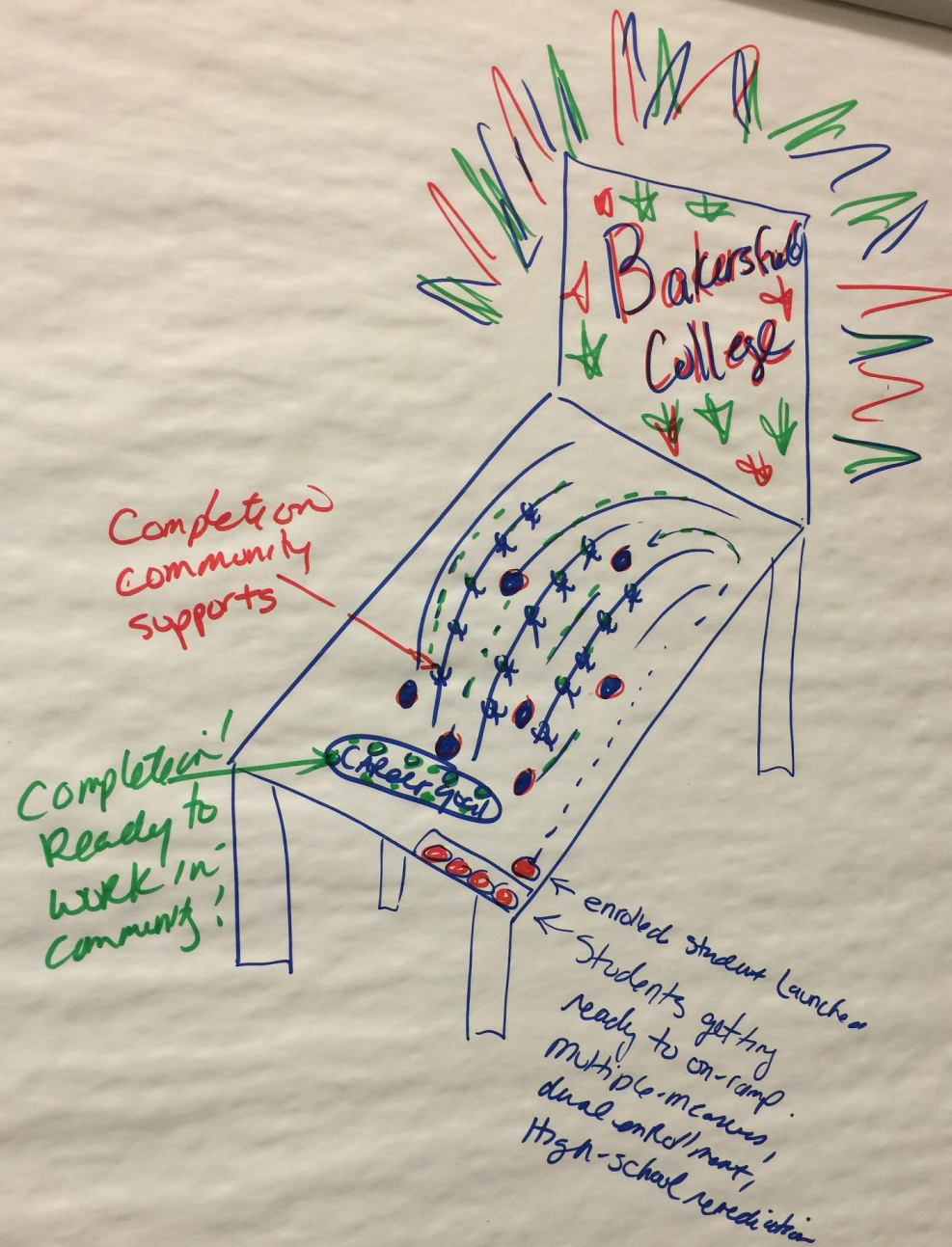

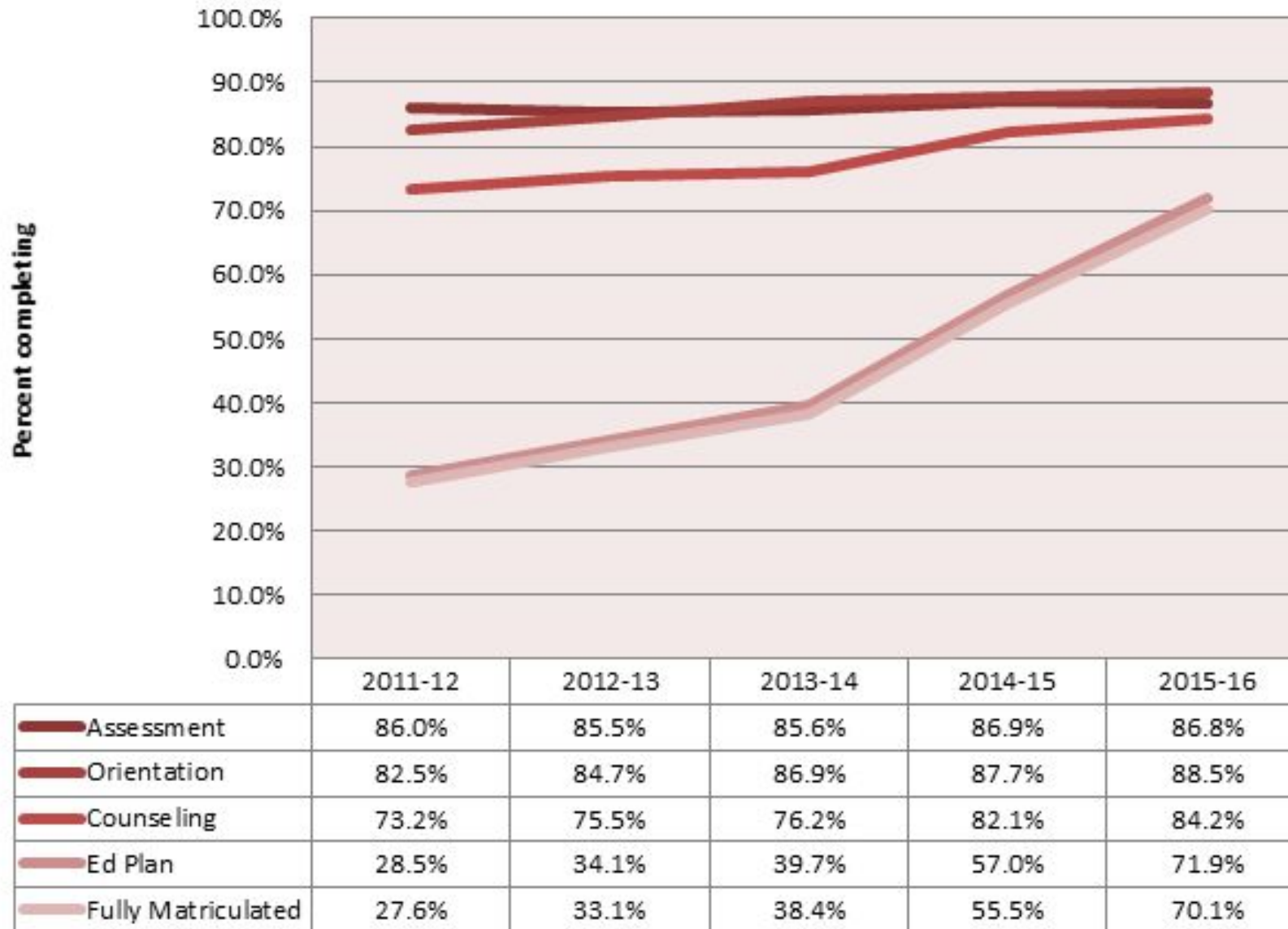

MATRICULATION SCALE-UP



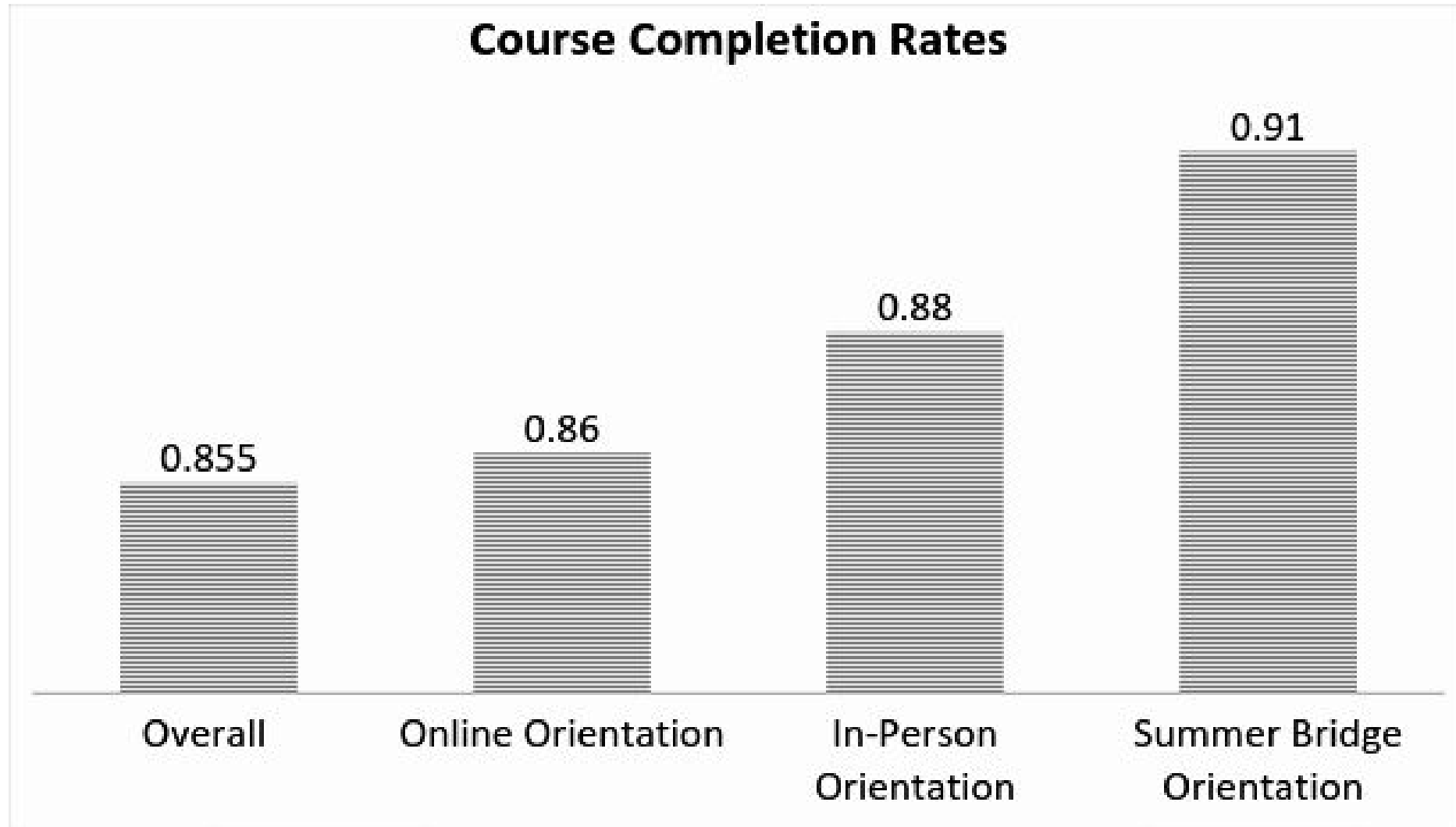
Percent First-time Students Completing Matriculation Steps (Intake Process)



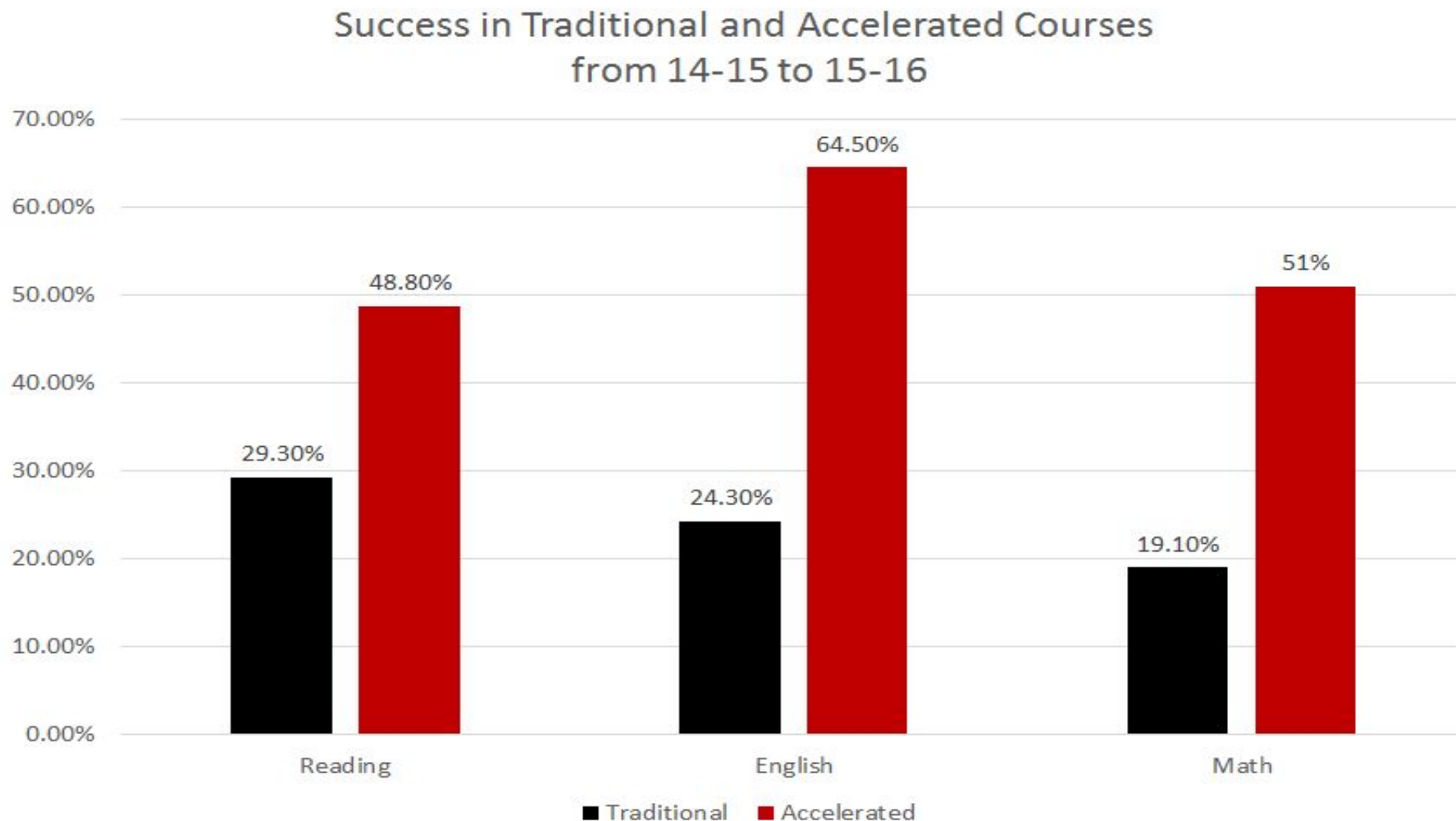

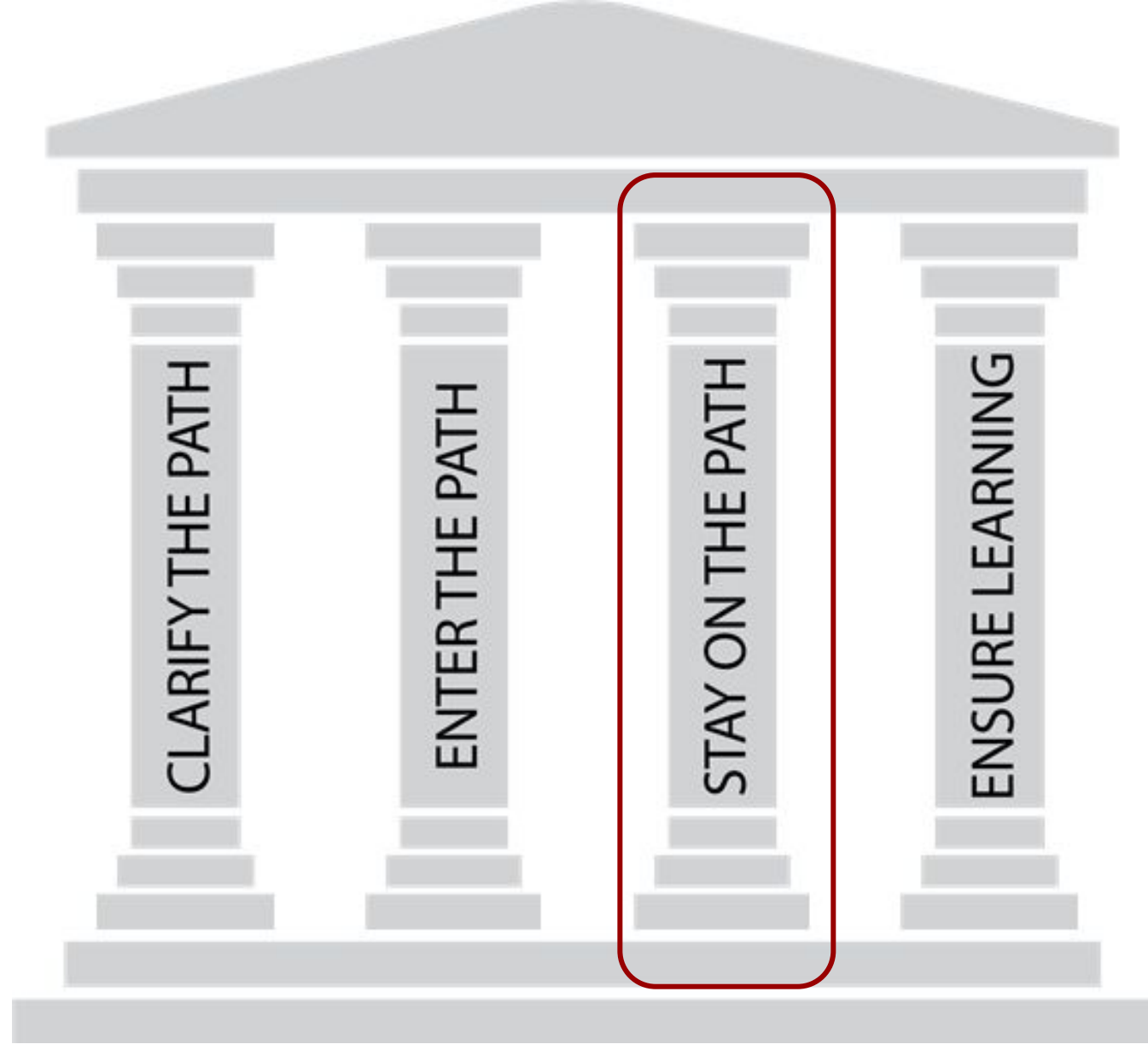

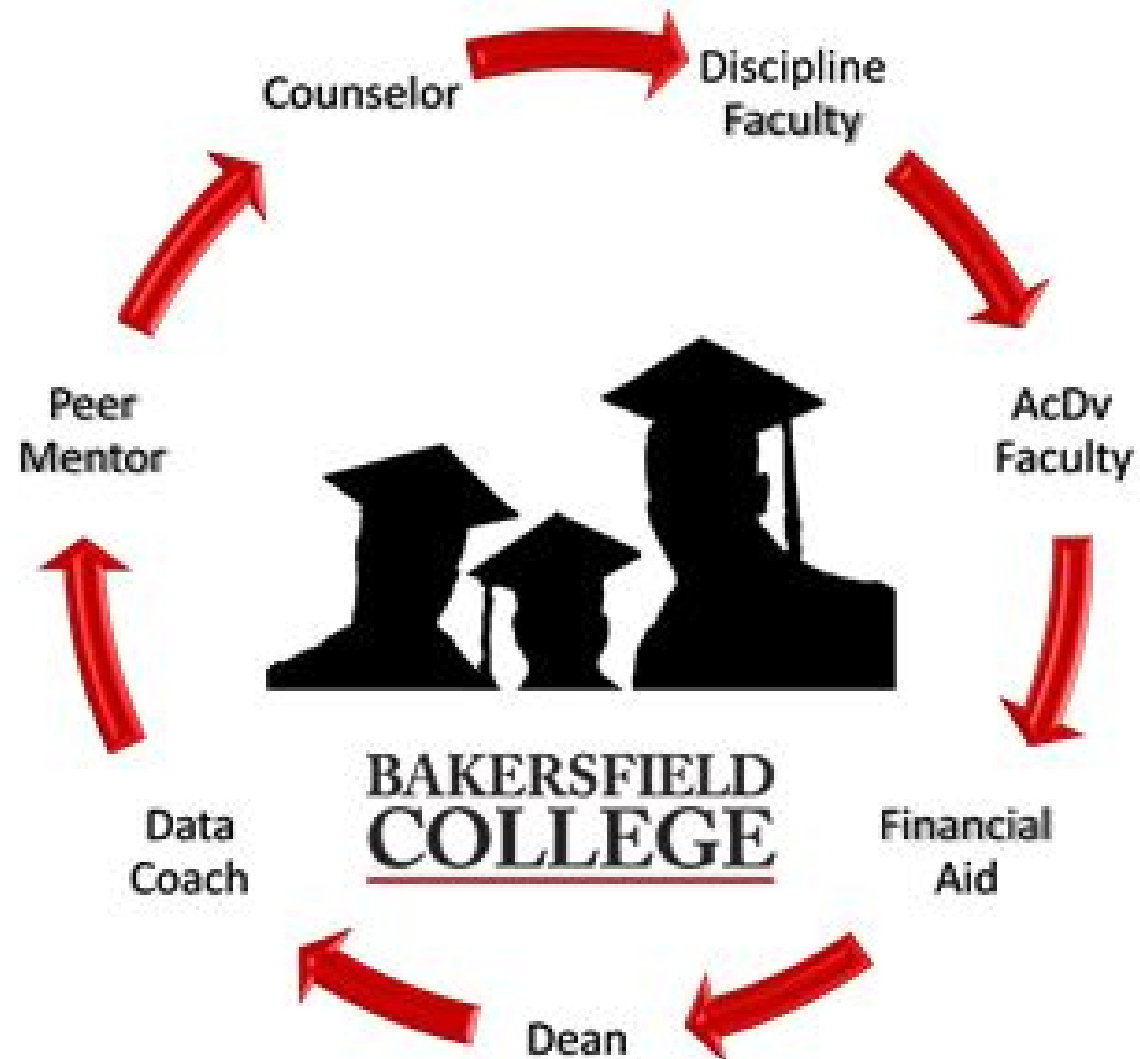
Figure 3. Course Success

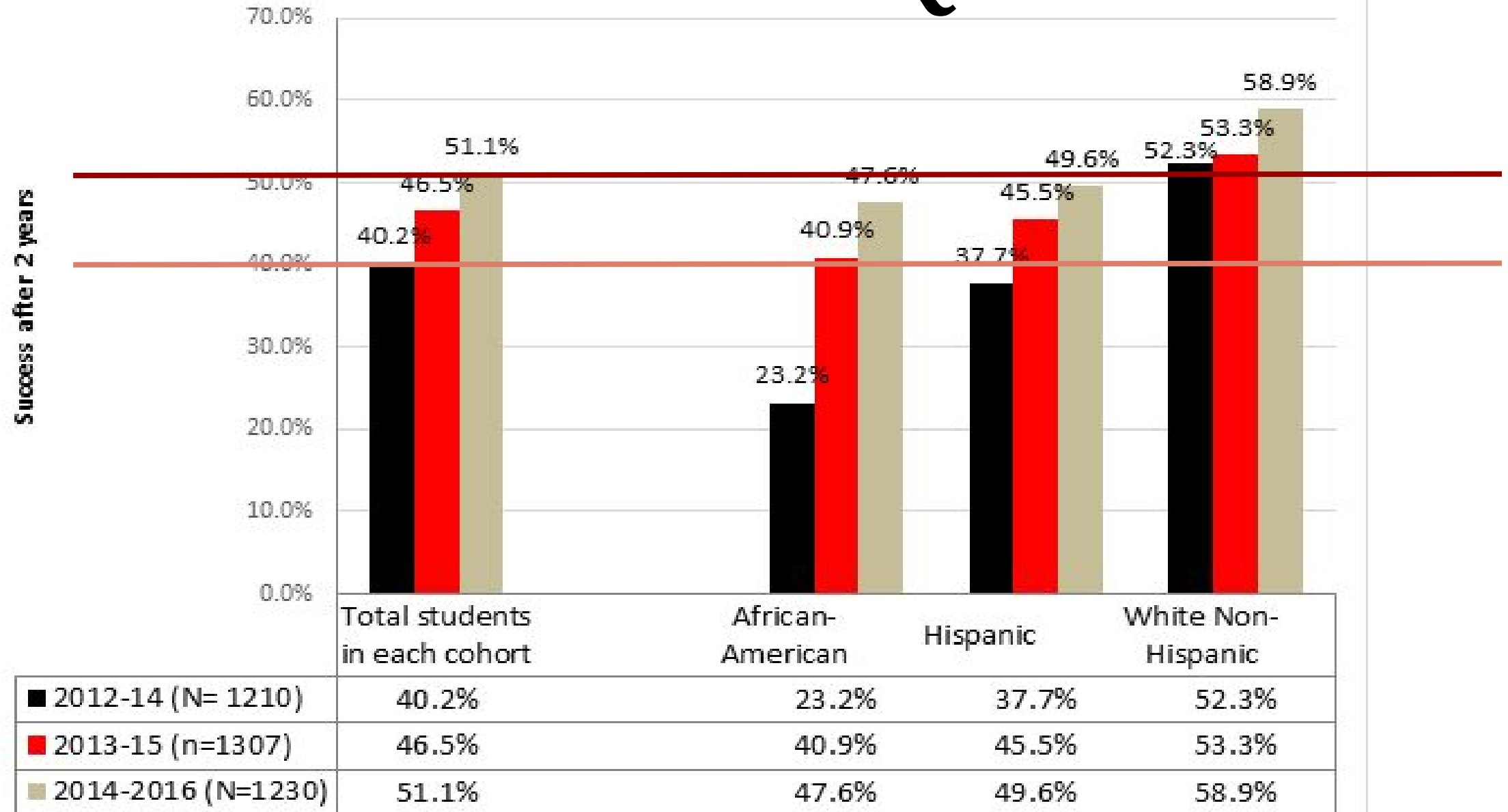

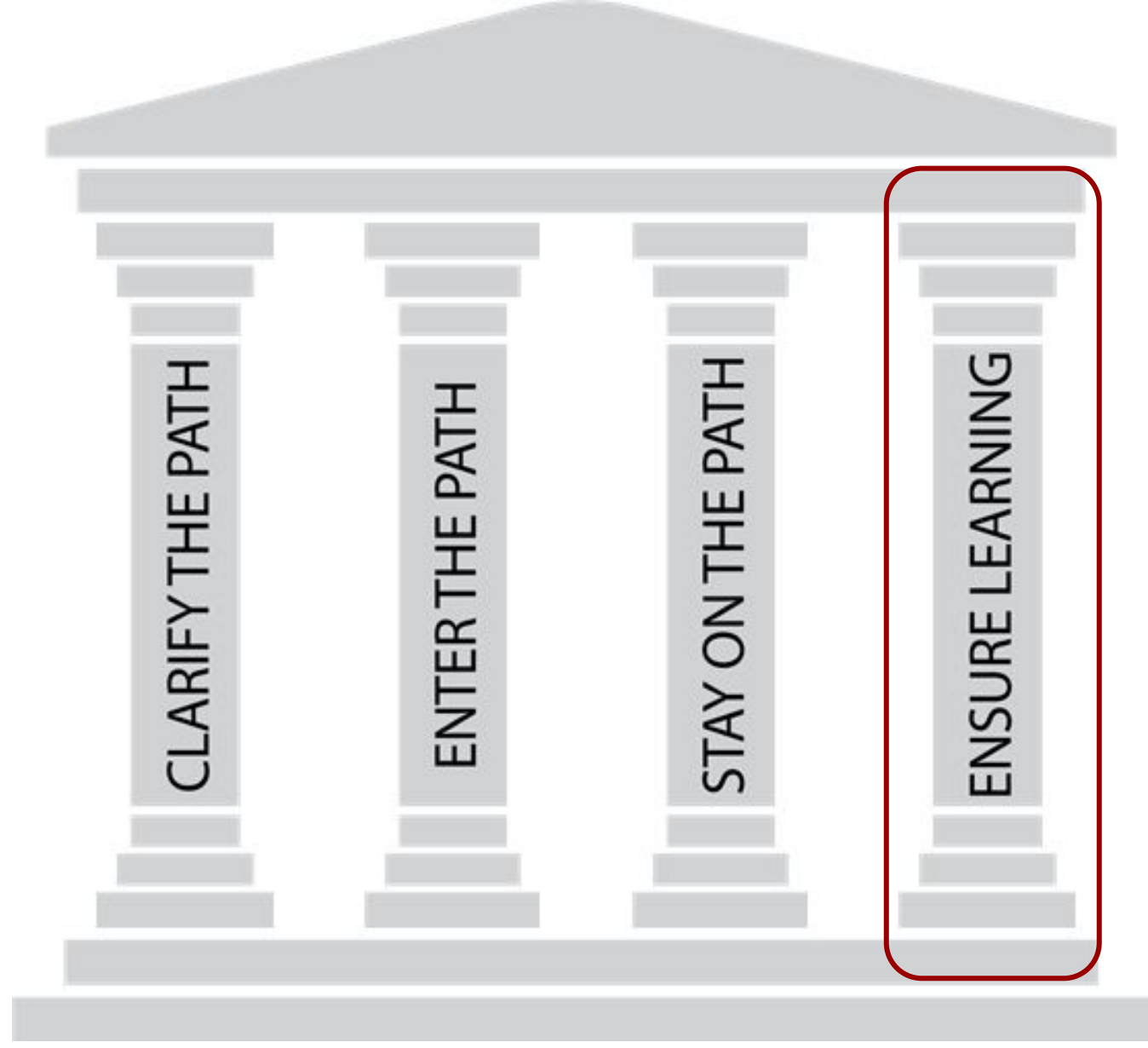

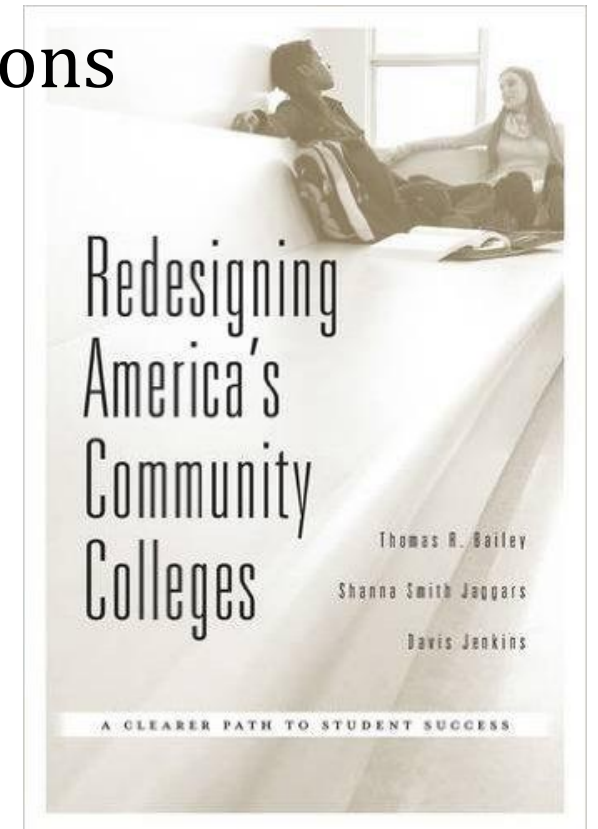

IMPLEMENTATION TEAM CHARGE

The focus of this taskforce is to implement the BC version of Pathways. This taskforce will be the **central communication hub** for pathways with required **reporting to groups they represent**. The taskforce will work with assigned areas to discuss meta-majors/areas of study and help coordinate information needed and documentation of pathways detail. The committee will **suggest, plan, and deliver professional development** at the winter and summer institutes and other meetings as determined by the taskforce. The taskforce will lead the ground work on the **implementation plans** pre- and post- AACC institutes.

The taskforce will help create the website for the Pathways webpage and any **written materials** for communication. It is likely that these members will play a role in writing key documents for accreditation related to pathways.

Immediate work products this committee will land before Spring 2017 semester are:

- ✓ Criteria for areas of study or meta majors
- ✓ Draft list of meta-majors
- ✓ Program pathway maps – completed by program faculty but organized by this taskforce
