	update the CLO for LS M02. •ICA/KIN/HED CLOs updated and reduced the number of quiz questions. Data collection sheet was customized for ICA/KIN/HED and Brock agreed to edit the tool.

3 Report from the SLO Symposium on 2/9/18 at Orange Coast College: Carol, Mahta and Dani	 Mahta: Attended breakout session on <i>Student Service/Academic Support</i> <i>outcomes: A New Perspective on Assessment</i> -East LAC developed Student Services Outcomes (SSOs) and assessment methods that make sense for faculty working with students in non- classroom settings. They Identified verbs that pertain to student services like how Bloom's Taxonomy works for instruction. Carol: Mentioned the keynote speaker was from the National Institute for Learning Outcomes (NILOA) and their website has good resources regarding SLOs, which includes textbooks on the subject. Attended breakout session on <i>Nuventive</i>, which talked about the feature of <i>Improve Analytics</i> (Moorpark does not have this feature). Provides data on status of SLOs by department, discipline, and courses. Dani: Attended breakout session on <i>Transitioning SLOs into Canvas</i> -Coastline College has incorporated their SLOs into Canvas and found it helped faculty to engage in the SLO process. Shared that the <i>eLumen</i> platform integrates various systems, such as curriculum, catalog, and learning outcomes assessment data (all systems talk to each other).
