Having considered the progress made towards its goals from the previous year Council is able to plan its goals for the coming year: what should the Senate Council be aiming to achieve on behalf of the faculty and our students? A draft document was brought to Council last meeting for discussion; additions were then made and a new draft is now available.

Action item requiring ratification by AS Council

Academic Senate means an organization whose primary function is to make recommendations with respect to academic and professional matters.

- "Academic and Professional matters" means the following policy development and implementation matters:
- 1. Curriculum, including establishing prerequisites
- 2. Degree & Certificate Requirements
- 3. Grading Policies
- 4. Educational Program Development
- 5. Standards & Policies regarding Student Preparation and Success
- 6. College governance structures, as related to faculty roles
- 7. Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation process
- 8. Policies for faculty professional development activities
- 9. Processes for program review
- 10. Processes for institutional planning and budget development
- Other academic and professional matters as mutually agreed upon.

#### c) AS membership contributions

All FT and PT faculty are automatically full members of the Academic Senate; many members choose to make an annual contribution towards some of the work of the Senate (our Annual Awards, the Distinguished Faculty chair, our "bricks" awarded for longevity of service, student scholarships, etc.). The current suggested amount of \$25 for FT faculty and \$10 for PT faculty was set many years ago and now is not allowing Council to continue all these things. Should the Council consider raising the suggested contribution or should it cut some of its expenses? If it should raise the amount, by how much? Action item.requiring vote by AS Council

### d) Workgroup on Senate "bricks"

Last year the Senate formed a workgroup to discuss the future of the Senate's "bricks" – its plaques awarded for long service to those who have taught for 50 semesters or more. The workgroup concluded that the bricks should be continued but agreed to continue meeting this year to discuss how this could be managed financially.
