a) VCCCD Strategic Plan - final draft

The District Committee for Accreditation and Planning (DCAP) has finished its extensive work updating the district's Strategic Plan. This now goes to the constituent members for any final recommendations before being forwarded to the Board of Trustees. This district strategic plan will form the base for the colleges' strategic plans.

- Academic Senate means an organization whose primary function is to make recommendations with respect to academic and professional matters.
- "Academic and Professional matters" means the following policy development and implementation matters:
- 1. Curriculum, including establishing prerequisites
- 2. Degree & Certificate Requirements
- 3. Grading Policies
- 4. Educational Program Development
- 5. Standards & Policies regarding Student Preparation and Success
- 6. College governance structures, as related to faculty roles
- 7. Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation process
- 8. Policies for faculty professional development activities
- 9. Processes for program review
- 10. Processes for institutional planning and budget development
- Other academic and professional matters as mutually agreed upon.

#### b) VCCCD Decision-Making Handbook – final draft

DCAP has also been updating the district's participatory governance handbook. An earlier version was on the AS Council agenda in February; this latest draft also includes a new district workgroup for enrollment management. After receiving any final recommendations the handbook will go forwards to the Board of Trustees.

These key BP/APs are due to be reaffirmed by the Board of Trustees but with no substantive changes.
