III) Old Business

a) Academic Senate Council membership

The Annual General Meeting of the Academic Senate froze the membership of our Council for one year in order to create a new system of representation that is fair to all faculty and independent from management reorganizations. A workgroup has been formed to research alternatives and come back to Council with recommendations.

b) Academic Senate Scholarships

The Academic Senate awards up to three scholarships to our students during the Spring semester. A workgroup has been formed to update the criteria and processes to be used, report back to Council, and then award the scholarships.

“Academic and Professional matters” means the following policy development and implementation matters:

1. Curriculum, including establishing prerequisites
 2. Degree & Certificate Requirements
 3. Grading Policies
 4. Educational Program Development
 5. Standards & Policies regarding Student Preparation and Success
 6. College governance structures, as related to faculty roles
 7. Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation process
 8. Policies for faculty professional development activities
 9. Processes for program review
 10. Processes for institutional planning and budget development
- Other academic and professional matters as mutually agreed upon.

a) **AP 4100: Graduation Requirements for Degrees and Certificates**

This recommendation was initiated through the district by our very own registrar in order to help our students succeed and now comes back to Moorpark to be approved. There are two very brief deletions to the prior Administrative Procedure that ensure that students may continue to use coursework from prior institutions in order to complete their certificates and degrees at Moorpark but do so without having to carry over the entire GPA from all their earlier college courses.

b) **BP/AP 5050: Enrollment Priorities**

This key BP/AP has to be relooked at almost annually but this update is fairly routine, clarifying the early enrollment status of dual enrollment students both at Middle Schools (for example our High School at Moorpark College) and under existing AB 288 College and Career Access Pathway partnership agreements to keep up with changing rules.
