Dear Jim,

The long-running struggle for fair accreditation practices has taken some positive turns in recent weeks. Last month, the Chancellor's Task force on Accreditation released a report recommending that the rogue Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges be replaced with another accreditor. That was followed by the Community College Board of Governors voting to direct Chancellor Brice Harris to send the report to the office within the US Department of Education that oversees authorization of accreditors, which will ultimately determine the ACCJC's fate. Then, the ACCJC tried to do some damage control with a rare public meeting that drew lukewarm support and harsh criticism.

The Board of Governors is scheduled to meet in November to accept the report and set in motion the plan to replace ACCJC.
