D) Public Comments

i) Accreditation of Moorpark College

Moorpark College received five commendations – on our “inclusive, engaging and robust dialogue undertaken during the annual program review process in support of program planning and student success”; our AD-Ts; our work with our diverse student populations (including our Vets Center and our GPS program); our professional development programs (our New Faculty Orientation particularly); and our “esprit de corps empowering students, and for embodying its “students first” philosophy through the integration of academic and student services programs.” We received three recommendations for improvement, two to continue our work with disaggregating our SLO data, and one ensuring our long-term financial planning is considered when making our short-term financial decisions. Hurray to ALL the many who were involved in this wonderful achievement!

ii) The district office has one recommendation for compliance – to “include as a formal component of the evaluation processes for faculty, academic administrators and other personnel directly responsible for student learning use of the results of assessment of learning outcomes to improve teaching and learning.” This means that in 18 months we provide a report on the district’s ability to reach compliance and we will have a follow-up visit from ACCJC.

- c) BP/AP 7211: Minimum Qualifications and Equivalencies
 - i) These are time sensitive as the district group meets to discuss on Thursday
 - ii) In 1.5 semesters, not one of 41 DWEC's were completed on time
 - iii) BP
 - (1) Number of graduate units now spelled out explicitly
 - (2) Coaching experience was added
 - iv) AP
 - (1) Will recommend changing 2/3 majority back to unanimous votes
 - (2) The AP states "Members may consult with discipline faculty at their colleges according to processes determined by each college." The other two Academic Senates prefer it worded this way as it does allow for different processes at different colleges. For Moorpark, however, we will consult our discipline faculty as we do currently.
 - (a) If discipline faculty reply then we will base our recommendations upon their input
 - (b) However, if there is no response from discipline faculty then the decision lies with the district DWEC
 - (c) Suggestion from Council to have a system of alternates in case the regular members are unable to attend
 - (d) We can formalize the process at Moorpark College ourselves
 - v) **Voted to approve with discussed amendments with Vance Manakas abstaining**

 - i) A few instructors trained elsewhere have been approved for online teaching here

 - iii) Online instructors must take the full training or apply for their previous Canvas training to qualify and be certified
 - (1) Certification program is advertised as 40 hours (20-40 hours estimated)
 - (2) If have online teaching experience already, then it may take significantly less time
 - (3) All sandbox materials developed during the certification program can be rolled over to assigned classes later
 - iv) There will be a number of training and tutoring sessions for those not teaching online courses
 - (1) Such users are not required to be certified
 - (2) There will be basic trainings and more specific trainings for those who have the basics down already
