SUBJECT: ASSOCIATE DEGREE FOR TRANSFER ADVISORY

In consultation with the California Community College Curriculum Committee (5C) and the Academic Senate, the Chancellor's Office has created three additional unique TOP Codes for Social Justice Associate Degree for Transfer (ADTs). These additional Top Codes will allow colleges the ability to create ADTs in the areas of focus in African American, Asian American and Native America Studies. As previously, the current Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC) template posted to the Chancellor's Office website will be used for the eight various Social Justice ADTs with the colleges entering the correct corresponding Top Code and title into the Chancellor's Office Curriculum Inventory system. The list of the Top Codes with the titles that must be used for the specified areas are listed below.

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Social Justice is one of the four areas of emphasis; therefore, community colleges are not mandated to create a Social Justice ADT. Also, if a college decides to create a Social Justice ADT in any one of the eight areas, there is no requirement that the college has to create an ADT in the other seven areas. Regarding Social Justice: General, colleges will be allowed to submitted more than one ADT is this category.

Additionally, an error was made in the TOP Code assignment for LGBTQ and Chicano Studies in the memorandum that went out in December. The above list now has the correct assigned Top Code to the two areas of focus.

Regarding the issue around "Oral Communication" for the IGETC pattern. Since, the IGETC pathway only requires six units instead of nine units some students are not being required to take "Oral Communications." However, the Chancellor's Office does not approve ADT's that do not have the "Oral Communication" requirement. The ADT's were created by law to transfer to the California State University (CSU) system and as part of the "golden four", it is necessary that the students meet the "Oral Communications" requirement.

Lastly, ASSIST is currently in the process of converting to Next Generation ASSIST and as a result, 2017-2018 articulations documents (AAM, BCT, and GECC) are not available for colleges to view or print. This is an issue since these three forms of documentations are required when processing ADT's; therefore, the Chancellor's Office is asking colleges to provide emails from the CSU in which they do have agreements with, detailing each course that articulates to that institution for that specific ADT, until ASSIST documentation becomes available.
