Discussion:

A. Public Comments

Julius Sokenu invited everyone to the first Year of Pathways and Detours event tomorrow, Wednesday, October 17, 2018. The event will take place in the TV Studio (Com 129) from 12pm – 12:50pm. Julius said he would be leading an interactive presentation on his pathway to a career in higher education.

He also congratulated the entire committee as he talked about Moorpark College's recent recognition as a 2018 Champion of Higher Education. The Campaign for College Opportunity recognized Moorpark College for excellence in student transfers. Moorpark College ranked at the top of the list with 1057 total awarded Associate Degree for Transfers. Second place was Pasadena City College with 1040, and third place was Orange Coast College with 898.

B. Current Events

Svetlana Kasalovic talked about the new Graphic Design courses. She said there is a need to have more Honors in the field, and these courses will have a further component of critical thinking.

Brock Cushman said the Kinesiology courses were not new, but have a TOP Code change.

Nathan Bowen said MUS M24 helps provide a clear pathway for student transfers. This course is for students that do not necessarily want to perform, but would like to teach K-12. This course is a corequisite to DANC M24. Together MUS M24 and DANC M24 meet General Education requirements for the Humanities section in Fine/Performing Arts (C1). Nathan also talked about MUS M34; this course emphasizes the development of skills needed to perform in an ensemble. It combines vocal ensemble with popular music. Singers will be able to improve their skill set.

Ruth Bennington had a question about Labor Market Information (LMI). She asked if LMI should be gathered by faculty or by the college. Oleg Bespalov confirmed that LMI must come from the Center of Excellence, and not from faculty.

Letrisha Mai talked about C-ID and 5-year review. She forwards email notifications to the faculty when C-ID descriptors are up for review. Jerry Mansfield mentioned he does the same thing. Letrisha suggested the Curriculum Committee members be included in those notifications. Nenagh Brown reminded everyone this review is done only one time every five years and encourages faculty to be actively involved in C-ID description.
