Welcome & approval of minutes	Minutes were reviewed.	Motion to approve minutes by Diane Scrofano and seconded by Matthew Morgan. Minutes were approved unanimously.
2. Issues with Canvas	When grading assignments, need to adjust settings in speed grader to avoid going through each assignment or clear cookies. Laura Gentry reported that she used one of the intergrated tools, flip grid, for discussion. She was unable to associate a rubric with it. When grading, she can see discussions on the screen as if it is an assignment and can see the responses. She has to use a paper rubric. Flip grid has a rubric but it only allows 100 character/rubric point. She liked that it was an interactive student conversation—all video. There is a software that allows for accessibility but you have to look for the button. Regarding turn it in, if you don't pre-rubric an assignment, you can't post-rubric the assignment if set up through turn it in.Students have a hard time seeing the turn it in feedback in Canvas.	
Use of DE Professional Development Funds from the District	Savings from adopting Canvas for professional development was divided by FTES (\$21k, 42%). Funding is focused for spring and must be encumbered by spring.  Committee discussed use of these funds and recommends the following: 1) \$1000 honorarium/professional expert fee (15-20 hrs/semester) for "online coaching" for Design to Align to OEI rubric, funding for 8 mentors/coaches, Joanna Miller to provide job description, 2) faculty attendance to the Online Teaching Conference in Anaheim, 3) OEI speakers (free) or accessibility speaker.	
Discussion of ALLY demo	Discussion deferred to OEI consortium proposal agenda item.	
5. Recap of Project FLOW	Governor would like a community college that is exclusively online (Flexible learning options for workers). Workgroup was formed(state-level) to come up with proposals to implement this idea. Options presented: 1) 100% separate college, 2) Assigned to a college 3) give project to OEI.

8. Workgroup on OEI Consortium proposal	Joanna reports OEI is opening its new cohort for 2018. Joining the consortium includes a host of services including free net tutor, ALLY if adopted, proctorials, professional development. IT is on board. If MC wants to participate, a letter of interest needs to be submitted by Dec. 15, a limited number of colleges will be accepted. AS has already approved to explore and move forward and it now needs to go to consultation council. Student services issues need to be resolvedhealth center fees/services, proctoring in ACCESS. If accepted an application packet will need to be completed in February. Committee votes to support joining OEI consortium.	Vote to move forward in joining OEI consortium was unanimously approved.
