1. Welcome members & approval of minutes	Co-chair Rachel Messinger welcomed committee members. Introductions were made. Nenagh Brown thanked everyone for being a part of this committee, especially for reviewing goals, facilitating the CANVAS transition, and the OEI recommendation. Minutes were reviewed.	Motion to approve the minutes was seconded. Minutes were approved as read. There were 2 abstentions: Cindy Sheaks-McGowan and Becky Brister.
2. November meeting proposal for 11/29/17	Rachel Messinger proposed that the November meeting date be set for Wednesday, Nov. 29 th . The 4 th Wednesday of the month is the regularly scheduled meeting day which would be Nov. 21 st but this is a non-instructional day.	Motion to meet on Nov. 28 th was seconded and approved with no objections.
3. Review and set goals for 2017-2018 academic year	Goals were reviewed and amended as follows: 1. Explore whether DE should have its own program plan 2. Explore joining OEI Consortium 3. Discuss Canvas training parameters and make recommendations to refine training to include accessibility 4. Expand professional development opportunities for current or prospective online resources faculty 5. Create voluntary faculty peer review/mentor program 6. Explore common language and presentation for DE scheduling and registration 7. Provide workshops for those who are evaluating instructors during tenure or the regular cycle of evaluation; provide also to Department Chairs or any interested parties 8. Continue accessibility training 9. Explore the expansion of Open Educational Resources (OER) at Moorpark College	
4. Update on Canvas certification and transition	Tracie Bosket reported that there are 181 people who received training at Moorpark College. There will be 2 courses this fall for certification that are listed on the DE website, one will start in October, the other in November. Tracie reports that the transition through the summer was relatively smooth.	
5. Merging of courses	If you have two sections of an online course, even if it's the same course, they need to be in separate Canvas course shells. However, if you are web enhancing then you can merge those courses but it needs to be requested; the request should be sent to Tracie Bosket. If instructors want courses combined, Tracie should be notified before instructors design courses. Jennifer will send this information in an email to the deans as schedules for the spring semester are currently being worked on.	
6. Online teachers faculty listserv proposal	Rachel Messinger suggested creating a listserv to communicate regarding Canvas that would be local to MC, Joanna Miller will check with IT.	
7. "Design to Align" pilot proposal	The goal is to prepare courses to be on the OEI exchange, faculty members who are interested in preparing their courses for the OEI exchange could review one section of their rubric each month as a group. The group could meet once a month with an interim online meeting. Joanna Miller suggested sending out an email to people who are Canvas certified to see if anyone is interested, there is an existing group of 10/15 who are already interested. If successful this semester, then next semester this first group could become paid mentors for the next group.	
8. Other workgroups	Currently we have a Certification workgroup. Jennifer Kalfsbeek mentioned the possibility of having a workgroup to explore the need to figuring out how to let students know about our online courses and programs or how to make it easier to find on our website.
