1. Welcome & approval of minutes	Meeting was moved to LMC 228 and began at 2:44 p.m. Minutes were reviewed.	Motion to approve minutes by Ruth Bennington and seconded by Danita Redd. Minutes were approved with one abstention by Becky Brister.
2. Issues with Canvas	Discussion of issues with Canvas. Speed grader problem, clear browser cache, cookies. Matt Spinneberg suggested iCab Mobile app which is a web browser for a small fee. Returning to previous page or undo is not available on Canvas, suggestion made to save on word document. Altering points on exams is difficult, solution suggestion to create a bank. Ruth Bennington suggested ZipGrade free app which is similar to Scantron, imports to Canvas and provides statistics.	
3. ALLY Demo (time TBD)	Ryan Sparks, representative for Blackboard Ally, presented a Webinair demonstration of this accessibility tool that can integrate directly with Canvas.Ally takes files that are loaded into the LMS and it automatically creates alternative formats. It also goes back into existing courses in LMS and creates alternative formats.Students and faculty will have access to the original version. Program allows downloading of accessible versions (documents), HTML accessible format (Matt Spinneberg mentioned that this takes several hours for him to do but it's automatic with ALLY), e-reader, electronic Braille, reader playback (MP3 audio file). Program is also helpful for ESL and commuter students. Ally does OCR scanning. Ally can do a search by key words. Instructor screen shows an icon for accessibility feedback, gives accessibility score and accessibility issues and information on how to fix accessibility issues.

Moorpark College has about 100 courses listed. Students will be able to sort courses by icon. There are some programs that have been built around zero cost, although this is not viable for every discipline and this is not an online course initiative.Child Development developed the first fully online zero textbook cost certificate across the state. ZTC is an equity issue.Some disciplines have bought books for students to use or loan in their courses. Agenda item tabled.
