Paragraph at end of Block II:

Current language:

In addition to considerations regarding program vibrancy and viability, programs may be identified for possible discontinuance in the event that the projected district operating reserves for a fiscal year fall below 6 percent, thereby necessitating consideration of programmatic reductions.

Suggestions:

- Move this paragraph to end of Block I, following the four courses of action (this paragraph should remain a paragraph; it should not become a fifth course of action).
- Define/clarify "projected district operating reserves."
- Clarify the reason for "6 percent" as the trigger.

1st Paragraph of Block II:

Suggested language:

1)

Each college will form a standing recommendation group comprised of three faculty members and two deans to examine programs for possible remediation or discontinuance. Alternatively, colleges may choose to assign this task to an existing standing committee. The recommendation group will have minimum 2/3 faculty representation, <u>as appointed by the Academic Senate</u>.

Motions related to the development of the above paragraph:

- Move to vote on whether or not we should propose either "majority" or "2/3" faculty representation.
 - Majority representation = 6 deans max / 7 faculty minimum 3 in favor / 17 opposed / 0 abstentions
 - 2/3 representation = 6 deans max / 12 faculty minimum -- 15 in favor / 2 opposed / 3 abstentions
- 2/3 representation Passes
- Move that our language reflect the recommendation group as a standing committee (one that is <u>not</u> Brown Acted but lives year-after-year; it is not part of the governing structure, per say – this standing committee would fall under the Academic Senate)
 - In favor: 11
 - Opposed: 2
 - Abstained: 2
 - Motion carries.
- 3) Move to approve block #2 with its current amendments. Motion carries.

Block IV

Suggested edit:

Upon receiving notification of the recommendations of the Executive Vice President concerning possible program discontinuance, the Academic Senate shall review and analyze the recommendations and supporting documentation and take one of the following actions:

1) Concur with the recommendations of the Executive Vice President; or

2) Demur with the recommendations of the Executive Vice President and propose an alternative course of action.

After reviewing and analyzing the recommendations and the supporting documentation of the Executive Vice President concerning possible program discontinuance, the Academic Senate shall respond with a justification of its agreement or disagreement.
