b. BP 2510: Participation in Local Decision Making (Moorpark Draft Update)

By State Senate's account, most senates tend to have "rely primarily" on at least three things: (1) curriculum, (2) degrees and certificates and (3) grading policies. And "only in exceptional circumstances and for compelling reasons" would the Board of Trustees not accept faculty's recommendations. The BP as submitted is a starting point; it is adapted from another university. It is understood that our senates need to review this BP.

In clarifying the MC practice within each of the 10+1 topics, we tend to

Rely Primarily in:

- Curriculum: Rely Primarily (faculty has primacy)
- Degrees/Certificates: Rely Primarily (faculty has primacy)
- Grading Policies: Rely Primarily (faculty has primacy)
- Policies for Faculty/Professional Development Activities: Rely Primarily (for the most part)
- Standards and policies regarding student preparation and success: Rely Primarily
 - o Although placement processes are mutually agree

Mutually Agree upon:

- Process for Program Review: Mutually Agree for the most part
 - o Program Plan: Rely Primarily
 - o Program Evaluation/Review Meeting process: Mutually Agree
- Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation processes: Mutually Agree
- Educational program development: Mutually Agree
- District and college governance structures: Mutually Agree
- Planning and budget: Mutually Agree

Rely Primarily – Faculty primacy

Mutual Agreement – Points are negotiated. Decisions made are documented in writing.
