CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY **GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS** 1991-92

California law empowers Moorpark College to certify to all campuses of CSU that a maximum of 39 lower division units required for General Education for a baccalaureate degree have been completed. The required pattern of course work is as follows: A. Communication and Critical Thinking, 9 units; B. Natural Sciences, 9 units; C. Humanities, 9 units; D. Social, Political and Economic Institutions, 9 units; E. Lifelong Understanding and Self Development, 3 units.

PLEASE NOTE:

WARNING — The courses and requirements hereon are subject to change.

COMPLETE CERTIFICATION — Completion of all five sections of these requirements prior to transferring will certify to each of the 20 schools on this map that you have fulfilled the basic 39 unit minimum lower division requirement in General Education prior to transferring (9-13 units of upper division general education work will need to be completed after transfer.)

PARTIAL CERTIFICATION — It is possible to complete separately any of the areas of sections (A-E) at Moorpark College and receive partial certification in each of those areas; it will be necessary for you to complete the remaining areas after transferring, as defined by the catalog of the transfer school.

U.S. HISTORY, CONSTITUTION AND AMERICAN IDEALS REQUIREMENTS — All campuses require at least one U.S. history and one political science course to satisfy this requirement (often in addition to GE requirements). Courses approved to satisfy this requirement are underlined within Area D.

CERTIFIED COURSES — Moorpark College will certify courses completed at other California community colleges in partial satisfaction of GE requirements provided that such courses are baccalaureate level and would be certified by the institution offering them. Students who have completed college courses at other schools should consult the Counsel-

> ing Office and catalogs of the four-year schools they plan to attend since the GE reguirements listed here may not be applicable.

USE OF MAJOR COURSES — Courses taken in the department of a student's major generally may not be used to fulfill GE requirements.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS — Students graduating from high school in June, 1988, or thereafter, must comply with the new admissions and graduation requirements as they are phased in over the next three (3) years.

Those students in continuous attendance at an accredited institution of higher education may transfer, and graduate, under the requirements in effect when they began. This "Grandfather" clause, however, does not include Intermediate Algebra (Math 3 at Moorpark College) which will not be classified as transferable or baccalaureate level if taken after Summer 1988.

Lower Division (1-55 units)


Students may be eligible for admission to CSU if:

a. They have satisfactorily completed CSU admissions requirements in high school.

b. They were eligible except for required subjects or a qualifiable eligibility index on the A.C.T. or S.A.T., and have now completed an approved program to remove deficiencies.

Upper Division (56-70 transferable units) Students must have a minimum 2.00 GPA. and have completed specified CSU G.E. and

subject requirements.
