MORE ABOUT IGETC

GPA REQUIREMENT

IGETC courses must be completed with a grade of C or better. A grade of Credit or Pass is acceptable, providing it is equivalent to a grade of C or higher at the institution where the course was taken.

USE OF AP EXAMS

IGETC course credit may be earned for acceptable scores of 3, 4, or 5 on Advanced Placement (AP) exams that the community college faculty recognizes as equivalent to its IGETC approved courses. An acceptable score on an English AP exam may be used to meet the English Composition requirement, NOT the Critical Thinking/English Composition requirement. Please consult with a counselor for the list of AP credits that Moorpark College accepts.

IGETC COURSE AGREEMENTS

- Courses completed at a California Community College will be applied to the subject area in which they were listed by the institution where the work was completed. Course work from other regionally accredited institutions will be placed in the same subject area as the equivalent Moorpark College course. Only courses deemed equivalent to those on the Moorpark College approved IGETC course list will be certified.
- A single community college course may be listed in the IGETC Course Agreement under more than on subject area; however, it may be used only once to satisfy one IGETC subject area. The University will allow students to use the same course to count toward the IGETC as well as major requirements.
- Course work use to satisfy the CSU requirement in U.S. History, Constitution and American Ideals may not be used to satisfy GE requirements for IGETC.

IGETC EXCEPTIONS

Students with a substantial amount of foreign coursework should be encouraged to follow the CSU General Education-Breadth program or UC campus general education program since the foreign coursework would not be a part of a student's IGETC certification.

MEETING FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT (UC only)

The Foreign Language requirement for IGETC may be met in one of the following ways:

- 1. Satisfactory completion of any MC foreign language course level I or higher.
- 2. Completion of two years of the same foreign language in high school with grade of "C" or better in the last semester of
- Satisfactory completion of 2 or more years of formal schooling at the 6th grade level or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English.
- Completion of a course at a college or university with a grade of "C" or better (any course, excluding conversation courses) to be equivalent to 2 years of high school language may be used.
- Equivalent proficiency demonstrated by a minimum score of 3 on an AP exam in languages other than English.
- A score of 5 or higher on the International Baccalaureate Higher Level Exam in languages other than English.
- 7. Satisfactory score on the SAT II: Subject Test in languages other than English.

Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT IGETC

The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) is a general education program which California Community College transfer students may use to fulfill lower-division general education requirements in either the UC or CSU system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses. The IGETC is most useful for students who want to keep their options open before making a final decision about transferring to a particular UC or CSU campus. Completion of IGETC does not guarantee admission, nor is it required for admission.

The IGETC is most advantageous for transfers who have not yet decided on a major or a campus. Once a student has identified a major, it is important for the student to work toward fulfilling any required preparatory courses, particularly in professional or "high unit" majors that select applicants on the basis of satisfaction of lower-division major requirements. It is important to note that this does not preclude a student from following the IGETC; however, the IGETC should not be chosen to the exclusion of completing any preparatory courses needed for admission.

In general, it is not advisable for transfer students preparing for engineering and high unit science majors (at any UC campus) to use the IGETC. Students entering high unit majors, such as those in engineering and the sciences, should focus on completing required lower division major preparation courses. Majors in the sciences, for example, not only have specific science prerequisites, but have substantial mathematics requirements as well.

CERTIFICATION:

"Certification" means that the last community college attended prior to transfer to the UC or CSU will verify that the student has completed the IGETC. It is the student's responsibility to request "certification" during the last semester of attendance at MOOR-PARK COLLEGE prior to transfer.

IGETC CERTIFICATION (FULL OR PARTIAL):

The last community college attended by the student prior to transfer must assume the responsibility for certification of IGETC. full or partial, regardless of the number of units the student has taken at that college. Courses completed at any accredited college may be used, however, the majority of course used to complete IGETC requirements must be taken at a California Community College. Credit awarded for Advanced Placement exams can be used to meet IGETC requirements. Students should consult a counselor to determine the applicability of course work and AP exam scores to IGETC subject area requirements.

PARTIAL IGETC CERTIFICATION:

It is expected that all students using IGETC as their general education pattern will have completed it prior to transfer. However, partial certification may be requested if severe hardship (MUST be documented) prevented the student from completing all required courses. Hardships may be determined to be: (1) accident or illness in the FINAL semester at MC; (2) work schedule changes in the FINAL semester at MC; (3) course cancellation by the college in the FINAL semester; or (4) documented counselor error. Area 1 and 2 CANNOT be completed after transfer. If any of the above exceptions or situations applies to your academic record, please consult with an MC counselor for more information.

MINIMUM UCTRANSFER REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSIONS:

- A Complete 60 semester units or 90 quarter units of transferable college credit with a grade point average of at least 2.4 (no more than 14 semester / 21 quarter units may be taken Pass/Not Pass), and;
- B Complete the following course pattern, earning a grade of C or better in each course:
 - Two transferable college courses (3 semester or 4-5 guarter units each) in English composition; and
 - One transferable college course in mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning; and
 - Four transferable college courses chosen from at least two of the following subject areas: the arts and humanities, the social and behavioral sciences, and the physical and biological sciences.

(COMPLETION OF IGETC WILL AUTOMATICALLY FULFILL THESE REQUIREMENTS.)
