

HOW TO CITE, USING THE 6TH ED. APA FORM, AN ARTICLE OUT OF A <u>FULL-TEXT DATABASE</u> SUBSCRIBED TO BY THE MOORPARK COLLEGE LIBRARY

When using an article reprinted in one of our electronic indexes, you will cite it in a way that allows the reader to locate the article. These are examples of suggested methods of citation you may want to use in your *References* page.

If you located your article in InfoTrac Academic OneFile :

1. If there is a DOI (digital object identifier) available for your article:

Author. (date). Title of the article. Name of the periodical, vol.(issue number), pages.

doi: xx.xxxxxxxxx

- 2. If there is no DOI (digital object identifier) available for your article:
- Author. (date). Title of the article. *Name of the periodical, vol.*(issue number), pages. Retrieved from [use the URL for the journal you are citing]
