

TEST-TAKING TIPS

Multiple Choice Tests

- Answer each question in your head before you look at the choices.
- Read all answers before selecting one because sometimes two answers will be similar and only one will be correct.
- ➤ If two answers are similar, except for one or two words, it's probable one of these will be the correct choice.
- ➤ If the answer calls for a sentence completion, eliminate the answers that would not form grammatically correct sentences.

True/False Questions

- Read carefully. Often one word can make a statement inaccurate.
- If any part of the true/false statement is false, the answer will be false.
- Look for *qualifying* words like *all, most, sometimes, never,* or *rarely.*These are the key words upon which the question depends.
- Absolute qualifiers like always or never generally indicate a false statement.
