Workable update without a to ground demo of the Poly Room	A recent #RealCollege survey showed that 38% of Moorpark College student respondents indicated experiencing food insecurity; 49.2% indicated experiencing housing insecurity; and 15.9% indicated they are homeless. These numbers, combined with system-wide averages of 50%, 60%, and 19% (respectively) for the aforementioned categories, demonstrate that our students are not having their basic needs met. When these basic needs are not being met students struggle in their curriculum and academic programs, threatening retention rates and overall student success. Currently a handful of Moorpark College offices (e.g., EOPS/CARE/CalWORKs, Financial Aid, Student Health Office, and the Student Success Center) offer grab-and-go snacks to students, but these efforts are not well coordinated, and their food supplies are unreliable.
