<p>1. Welcome and Introductions, Membership – John Sinutko welcomed members and began the meeting.</p>	
<p>2. Discussion of Previous Meeting Notes – the committee approved the notes from the September 17, 2019 meeting.</p>	
<p>3. Reports • Facilities Update – J. Sinutko</p> <p>Gym Renovation – this project is nearing completion, with the first floor a bit further ahead than the second. All painting has begun. A punch list will be compiled today.</p> <p>Outdoor Kinesiology Classroom – Phase 2 of this project will go out to bid again soon, although the funding source is unknown at this point. The planting plan and 805 Strong memorial proposed for this area has been favorably received, but is on hold pending the outcome of the upcoming bid.</p> <p>Campus Wayfinding – an updated cost estimate for this project will hopefully arrive tomorrow from Little Architects; this will reflect electrical, civil and structural engineering expenses.</p> <p>Field House and Shade Structure – this project is 93% complete with its final punch list. Some of the HVAC duct work will need to be corrected in the attic space.</p> <p>EATM Lion Habitat – the preconstruction meeting for this project will take place this Thursday morning, October 17th. Work will begin on Monday, October 21st.</p> <p>Emergency Communication Systems Update – this project will be taking place over the next year and a half.</p>	



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Topic	Action
<p>Performing Arts Projects – the main stage rigging will be repaired over the upcoming winter break. The stage floor and scene shop floor are slated to be replaced soon, followed by the speakers.</p> <p>Stadium Lighting Repair – this project will go out to bid in the near future.</p> <p>Stadium Roadway Repair – crews anticipate being able to pave over the newly installed water line on October 29th.</p> <p>District Solar PV Paneling – survey work for this project was completed last week. Geo testing will take place this Friday, October 18th. The project will involve panel installation in the AA, A, B and C parking lots.</p>	
<p>4. Old Business – a few buildings on campus, such as Physical Science, don't currently have the custodial closet storage space that would allow for the collection and separation of recyclables. These areas may be able to receive mobile carts that can be moved to other locations when necessary; John and Eric will discuss it in further detail. James Polluck and Karin Johansson will also work on printing flyers and signage for offices; these will illustrate which materials can and cannot be recycled. Associated Students will begin drafting a campus sustainability plan during the last week of October, with an outline to be presented at the November meeting. In the meantime, James Polluck will investigate the battery and cartridge recycling bins that were previously acquired by Cassandra Cardoza. Scott Colvin and Waste Management may be good resources for further information regarding the pickup and disposal of certain items.</p>	
<p>5. New Business – James Polluck informed the committee about the presence of two art installations between the A and B parking lots, from 1993 and 1995. They have apparently been broken and neglected for some time. Photos will be presented at the November meeting so that committee members can determine whether to recommend their repair, or removal and replacement. Students should have the opportunity for input as well.</p>
