<p>1. Welcome and Introductions, Membership – John Sinutko welcomed members and began the meeting.</p>	
<p>2. Discussion of Previous Meeting Notes – the committee approved the notes from the April 17, 2018 meeting.</p>	
<p>3. Discussion of Last Year’s Goals and Accomplishments – the committee reviewed its achievements for the previous year, including the continuation of the Nature’s Finest campus garden space, the continued use of green cleaning products across campus, the installation of a hydration station at Communications, and the repair of damaged existing sidewalks. Associated Students would like to plant fruit trees in the garden and add more plants to the oasis area. A conduit path was also determined that would tie power for the garden to a source at the zoo; this would eliminate the need for solar power in the area as long as this source is connected to a GFI. Suggested fruit trees for the area include grapefruit and pomegranate; representatives will present an official plan at the October meeting. A hydration station would also be welcome near the Technology Building, but finding an ideal location may prove difficult. The eventual goal is for every drinking fountain to be replaced with a hydration station. Associated Students would also be happy to have any information from Kim Oakley, Moorpark’s CalRecycle representative, regarding possible recycling awareness activities for the campus.</p>	<p>Associated Students would be willing to assist with funding for the installation of additional stations and the replacement of older trash receptacles.</p>
<p>4. Reports › Facilities Update – this section of the meeting was kept brief; John will forward the current list of campus projects to Associated Students for their references.</p>	
<p>5. Old Business – a link was installed from the campus fountain to the irrigation system. The fountain was also fitted with a sensor that turns off the water in the event of high winds, and the bottom interior has been repainted. All cracks have been sealed, which will hopefully mean a reduction in water loss.</p>	
<p>6. New Business – Brian Sherman would like to join the committee, so he will be invited to future meetings. Proposals for solar energy on campus are being refined; if approved, panels would be installed above the parking structure. Campus wayfinding signage is also under review with architects.
