VI) New Business

A. Emergency Temporary Distance Education Blanket Addendum

To continue teaching our classes online in response to Covid-19 the state Chancellor's Office requires the college to have a plan for obtaining local DE approval for all courses offered in the Summer and Fall by December 30, 2020. The plan can include the options of stating that distance education is not appropriate for some disciplines and for others that it will only be done in emergency situations and with a mutual agreement (between management and the department). This is the explanation and flow chart Moorpark will be using with all programs to decide what action is best for each of their courses.
