 - 1) Erik Thank you to everyone and thank you to Trustee Perez for joining us.
 - a) Regarding to the process Assumptions, Criteria, and Guidelines. We are voting on behalf on the college. Thank you to Dean Bespalov and his team for the data. Presentations are largely 3 minutes a piece or 6 minutes for two requests. We will first hear from the categorial requests. Then we will start on general. We chose geography at random with a number generator as the starting point for general fund requests.
 - b) How to fill out the ballot was demonstrated. Please send your completed ballo to both Nicole Block and Erik Reese. We will both independently collate the results and then compare the results as a double check. You are welcome to stay after prioritization to observe the tally. The results are first forwarded to the College President then to Senate Council and Dean's Council.
 - 2) Comment Three disciplines that have two positions. If you have multiple positions, I do encourage you to suggest which one is a higher priority. You will be asked that question. Thank you for that.
 - 3) Question Could we vote high on every single one. Are we required to break it down?
 - 4) Erik The vote is roughly a third each of high, medium and low. For our 23 requests, one votes for eight highs (5's), eight mediums (3's), and seven lows (1's). There are also opportunities to ask questions later.
 - 5) The Order of Business began by Erik Reese
 - a) A specific time slot was offered to any presenter with time constraints. There were none.
 - b) Two positions requested from Categorial Funds
 - c) One mandated position request
 - d) Twenty-three positions requested from general funds to be prioritized. Speaking order started from number eleven (randomly selected) and then continued in alphabetical order.
 - 6) Submission of voting sheets turned into Erik Reese and Nicole Block via email.
