Performing Arts Stage Floor and Scene Shop Floor Replacement – initial work was completed, but there are a few issues that need correcting.	
FLRs (Flexible Learning Rooms) – four socially distanced learning spaces have been established on the former practice soccer field. Crews are working on completing the surrounding parking lot, as well as another structure that will also serve as warehouse space.	
Stadium Restroom Replacement – this project is underway.	
5. Old Business – Karin Johansson has several new photos ready to post on the committee website, which continues to be a work in progress. Alexander Fredell will be contacted at the District Office so that Esther Kim may be given access to assist on the site, and advised about upcoming Drupal training.	
6. New Business – Karin Johansson shared her recent discovery of the fact that Moorpark College is situated on Chumash land, and suggested that perhaps a mural would be a way of both honoring its Chumash heritage and beautifying the campus. Brian Sherman and Steve Timmons pointed out that the Earth Dome located near EATM might be an ideal place for a mural, as well as fresh landscaping that would complement the aesthetic.	Committee members are interested in seeing a design plan for a possible Chumash mural at the Earth Dome near EATM.
Steve Timmons explained that the current tennis courts may soon become sand volleyball courts, and as part of the preparation for this project, he suggested the removal of the four large pine trees nearby. Unfortunately these trees create difficult messes to clean from the existing courts due to sap, needles and bird waste; their roots are also already beginning to warp the newly installed sidewalk leading to the police station and parking structure. However, as part of the OTC Roof landscaping, between 25 and 30 new trees will be planted on that project site. The wood from the four current pines can also be mulched for both future landscaping and EATM animal habitats.	The committee unanimously approved recommending the removal of the four existing pine trees near the tennis courts.
