Update from: October 2020

- Continued its review of the college Enrollment Plan for this second reading and voted to forward it to the AS Council.
- Brainstormed data metrics for effective online pedagogy in our online world; thanks to Shannon Macias and Matt Calfin, DE Committee co-chairs, for joining the discussion. A mid-semester report will be presented to the committee in November to help inform its planning role, especially in relation to enrollment management.
- Evaluated the success of the Areas of Interest breakout exercise that was included in the Guided Pathways Retreat in encouraging cross-program plan synergy. Thanks to Traci Allen, GP Faculty Liaison, for joining the meeting. The consensus was to hold a similar exercise within the Areas of Interest annually and at a time that would allow for new ideas to be included in program plans.
- During this discussion interest expressed by several members for reviewing how to write the program plans more effectively, calling for more cross-program synergy at this point in the process.
- Introduced discussion on how to implement the Joint Meeting with Fiscal Planning Committee next semester, as now called for in the *Participatory Governance Handbook*.

Update from: February 2020

- Reviewed the infrastructure model and the full-time equivalent student (FTES) report. Current estimates suggest Moorpark College is down 431 FTES from its target value for Spring.
- Discussed the proposed updated Allocation Model that aligns with the Student-Centered Funding Formula (SCCFF).
 - Class Schedule Delivery Allocation accounts for the faculty required to match the FTES at each college
 - o The remaining funds are split between
 - 70% Base allocation includes a component based on college size with remaining funds proportional to FTES
 - 20% Supplemental allocation related to number of Pell Grant recipients,
 AB540 students, and Promise Grant recipients
 - 10% Student success allocation based on degrees, certificates, etc.
- Joint EdCAP/Fiscal meeting to review college resource recommendations in relation to the Strategic Plan for gap analysis and recommendations
 - Experimental process to link resource allocation closer to planning and enhance communication and transparency on planning and resource allocation

- Prioritized and funded items have been collected towards the bottom of the <u>Planning website</u> as a resource
- Used the Annual Work Plan 2020-2021 on <u>SharePoint</u> to perform the gap analysis by comparing goals, resources, and current progress
- Will debrief on the process/activity next month and discuss future improvements and other reflections

- Cindy Sheaks-McGowan gave an update on ZTC information with the committee and to ask if this committee has ideas of possible ways to coordinate the educating of our faculty and/or additional ideas to get the word-out. Committee asked questions and discussed. Suggestions made to create a clearinghouse of info for faculty and to focus on equity.
- Good January Flex attendance: averaged 45/50 at each (one had close to 80). One of the good-role-model sessions was 'Culturally Responsive Student Services'. B. Burns is working with a student worker to complete the captioning of each session.
- Committee continues to explore ways to get the pulse of the campus to increase attendance.
- PD funds-they are available for online conferences and webinars. One request can be made each year, no matter if cost is less than the up-to \$500 allowed, since too difficult to track actual final cost spending.
- Committee is working with IR to survey people who have completed diversity training. Pulling and analyzing the data will be easier to do beginning Fall 2021. Maybe a cohort of 20'ish people each semester for an 'Equity in the classroom' type of training.
- Kudos-G. Chacon and E. Reese are working on Kudos. M. Ashton reminded the committee that if any changes are made, it needs District marketing approval before posting.
