	 Sidewalk Additions – Research the possibility of installing additional walkways on campus for pedestrian safety. 	Repairs of existing sidewalks continue on campus on an as-needed basis.
	 Campus Water Reduction – Conserve water usage at the college in observance of the current severe statewide drought. 	Moorpark College has continued to significantly reduce water consumption campus-wide over the past fiscal year. A new irrigation system is 75% completed, replacing the prior system which was over twenty years old. The new system also has the ability to track and compare monthly rates of water usage.
	 Campus Sustainability Plan – Encourage student participation in the committee via a student-created plan for improved environmentally friendly practices and education at the college. 	Student committee members presented a revised first draft of the campus sustainability plan, to be visited in more detail upon a gradual physical return to the campus.

Encourages responsible environmental practices	 Campus Recycle Plan – Continue to implement the campus recycle plan. 	Campus recycling receptacles continue to be monitored and emptied.
	 Additional Filtered Hydration Stations – Recommend the installation of additional filtered water stations on campus in order to encourage the use of refillable, rather than plastic, bottles. 	All campus hydration stations and drinking fountains were shut down this year in order to prevent COVID-19 spread, but stations will continue to be added to the parts of the campus that need them, particularly as new projects are completed.
