Dear Colleagues and Students,

Thank you so much for your patience as we navigate this return to campus and the upswing in Covid cases.

Several concerns and misconceptions have popped up since the first day of school and I want to clarify these points.

1. Being a secondary contact of someone with a positive Covid-19 test is NOT cause for quarantine. (Example: My husband was exposed to someone at work with a positive Covid-19 test. I do not need to quarantine.) That said, if you develop symptoms of Covid-19, please get tested even if you are vaccinated. Breakthrough cases in the fully vaccinated are **well below 1%** but happen. [If you have Covid-19 test results, please upload.](#)
2. If you have a blue pass, and you are exposed to someone with Covid-19, you may check “no” for the exposure question. Actual wording on the pass is

“In the last 14 days, have you been exposed to anyone who tested positive for Covid, has Covid symptoms, or has been instructed by a healthcare provider to self-isolate?

(Unless you have a Blue Campus Pass or have been cleared by College Student Health Center)”

3. If you have been fully vaccinated, PLEASE upload your vaccination card to the MyVCCCD app. [Here are the simple instructions.](#) Doing so will save you a lot of time and frustration in the event of a classroom exposure.
4. If you have NOT been fully vaccinated, you will have to quarantine for 10 days every time you are exposed to Covid-19, even if you test negative for Covid-19, and even if you are eventually granted a waiver. Doing so keeps you, fellow classmates, faculty and staff, friends and loved ones safer.

Time is ticking. Fully vaccinated means that 14 days have passed since the last dose of your vaccine. You will need to be fully vaccinated by 10/15 in order to attend class on 10/16.

Here is a helpful timeline by vaccine:

Moderna

First dose by 9/3/21

Second dose by 10/1/21

Fully vaccinated: 10/15

Pfizer

First dose by 9/10/21

Second dose by 10/1/21

Fully vaccinated: 10/15

J&J

Only one dose needed, by 10/1
Fully vaccinated: 10/15

Shot clinic 9/9/21

10a-2p

Observatory parking lot (Lots D and E)

If new clinics are scheduled, we will send out an email letting you know. And as always, if you have any questions, please contact me. And know that we are doing all of this to keep you, your colleagues, friends, and loved ones as safe as possible from Covid-19 infection.

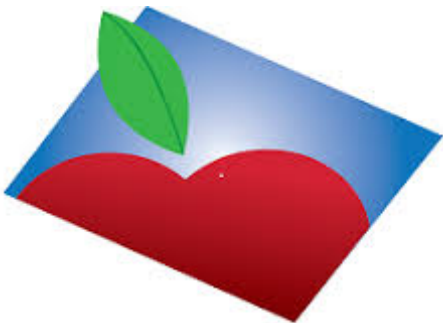
