PROGRAM OF STUDY

Associate in Arts in Journalism for Transfer (AA-T)

The Associate in Arts in Journalism for Transfer (AA-T) is intended for students who plan to transfer and complete a bachelor's degree in Journalism, or a related major at a CSU campus, or who plan to attain an entry-level position in the news and information industry. Students completing the AA-T degree in Journalism are guaranteed admission to the CSU system, though not necessarily to a particular CSU campus or major of their choice. Students should consult with a counselor for more information on individual university admission policies and transfer requirements.

To earn an AA-T in Journalism, students must:

- 1. Complete 60 semester or 90 quarter CSU transferable units.
- 2. Obtain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.0 in all CSU-transferable coursework. While a minimum of 2.0 is required for admission, some transfer institutions and majors may require a higher GPA.
- 3. Complete 18-24 specified major units. All courses in the major must be completed with a grade of C or better or a "P" if the course is taken on a "pass-no-pass" basis (Title 5 § 55063). Even though a "pass-no-pass" is allowed, it is recommended that students complete their major courses with a grade.
- 4. Obtain certification of the California State University General Education-Breadth (CSU GE-Breadth) or the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC for CSU) pattern.
