LAW, PUBLIC POLICY, AND SOCIETY FOR TRANSFER

Program Requirements: Includes course requirements and sequencing that reflect program goals.

The Associate in Arts in Law, Public Policy, and Society for Transfer (AA-T) is intended for students who plan to transfer and complete a bachelor's degree in American Studies, Communications, Criminal Justice, Criminology, Global Intelligence and National Security, International Relations, Philosophy, Political Science, Social and Behavioral Sciences (Political Economy Concentration) or a major deemed similar at a CSU campus. Students completing this AA-T degree are guaranteed admission to the CSU system but not necessarily to a particular campus or major of choice. Students should consult with a counselor for more information on admission to specific universities and their transfer requirements as individual schools may require different or additional course work to that listed for the AA-T Law, Public Policy, and Society.

To earn an AA-T Law, Public Policy, and Society, students must:

1. Complete 60 semester or 90 quarter CSU transferable units.

2. Obtain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.0 in all CSU transferable coursework. While a minimum of 2.0 is required for admission, some transfer institutions and majors may require a higher GPA.

3. Complete 32 specified major units. All courses in the major must be completed with a grade of C or better or a "P" if the course is taken on a "pass-no-pass" basis (Title 5 § 55063). Even though a "pass-no-pass" is allowed, it is highly recommended that students complete their major courses with a grade.

4. Obtain certification of the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education-Breadth (CSU GE-Breadth) pattern.
