- (9) Processes for program review
- (10) Processes for institutional planning and budget development
- (11) Other academic and professional matters as are mutually agreed upon between the governing board and the academic senate

A. Academic Senate Goals for 2021-2022

B. Draft VCCCD Strategic Goals, Measures of Achievement, and Strategies

The board of trustees adopted new district goals at the July 10, 2021 board of trustees strategic planning session. Measures of achievement (metrics) for these goals and strategies to reach those measures have been included along with connections to the Vision for Success and college Educational Master Plans. Input from the colleges on this initial draft will be incorporated into the VCCCD Strategic Plan.

C. IEPI PRT Institutional Innovation and Effectiveness Plan

Last spring, Moorpark invited and was visited by an Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative (IEPI) Partnership Resource Team (PRT), with whom many of you spoke and interacted. An initial plan with areas of focus related to equity and social justice was drafted based on the input and menu of options from the PRT. Input from all stakeholders will be solicited to produce the final plan. Input from the Associated Students has been incorporated into this draft. This will be a standing item until Standing Committees provide input and make recommendations for final consideration in Senate Council.

A. Elections of Faculty Co-Chairs for DE, PD, and SEA

Standing Committee Faculty Co-Chairs are elected by Academic Senate Council (By-Laws Article VIII, Section A, 1). Candidate statements were sent to Council on Sep 7 and posted on the <u>Senate Elections page</u> for the following candidates:

- Distance Education Committee (DE)—Christy Douglass
- Professional Development Committee (PD)—Jamee Maxey & Beth Gillis-Smith
- Student Equity and Achievement Committee (SEA)—Jennie Whitlock

There will be a final call for nominations from the floor before the elections begin, consistent with the write-in candidate option as part of the Election Rules. A simple majority of votes in the Academic Senate Council is required for election of faculty cochairs (By-Laws Article VIII, Section A, 1).

D. Academic Senate Constitution and By-Laws Workgroup Update

The Academic Senate Constitution states that "The Academic Senate Council shall reexamine the Constitution at least once every six years and the By-Laws at least once every two years" (Article IX). Amendments to both documents require a majority vote to first be placed on the agenda. Constitutional amendments require a two-thirds vote of the general membership. Amendments to the By-Laws require a two-thirds vote in Senate Council. It is time to revisit both the Constitution and the By-Laws. How will Senate lead equity and social justice efforts on campus, in the district, and beyond? A workgroup was formed to provide recommendations for Senate Council.

E. Academic Senate Scholarship Process Documents

F. Registration Priority—TRIO

Federal TRIO programs identify and provide services for individuals from disadvantaged backgrounds. Adding TRIO students to priority group 2, after statutory groups, for registration priority was brought to the District Technical Review Workgroup – Student Services (DTRW-SS) for consideration. Enrollment priorities are documented in the handout Administrative Procedure 5055 Enrollment Priorities (group 2 highlighted for reference). Currently only Oxnard College has a TRIO program.
