Consists of 4 workshops introducing UDL and its principles and an opportunity for peer review. Pilot cohort is expected to roll out by Jan. 24th, with a full implementation of program planned on March 24th. Faculty would also be trained to analyze equity data and develop plans to improve metrics in courses and programs.
