John Loprieno Taking on a production of this size is daunting under the best of circumstances. One might say that attempting it during a COVID resurgence is impossible. When we returned to campus in January we found that the first two weeks of instruction would have to take place outdoors or not at all. For two seconds, we faced the hard choice of cancelling this production. But our students, both technicians and performers, responded to us with a resounding "NO!" And here we are, eight weeks later, back in the PAC, opening our first full mainstage production since we abruptly cancelled our "Romeo and Juliet" in March of 2020. Despite all COVID threw at us, we are here! Given the tumultuous times in which we find ourselves cautiously emerging from a global pandemic, facing a war in Ukraine as well as ongoing internal political strife at home, "Kinky Boots" with its messages of unity, compassion and acceptance can't come at a better time.

I often wonder how our students navigate the duality of the contradictory world in which they live today. They embrace social justice initiatives that focus on diversity, equity and inclusion and these laudable ideals are driven by the same students that have inherited a culture of intolerance and inequity. So, as a college, we listen to the wisdom of our students and seek to assist them in creating a world that they can imagine in their minds that allows everyone to "just be." Yet, the nightly news cycle tells us stories of books being banned, states investigating parents of transgender children for child abuse and the passing of "don't say gay" laws. To their credit, our students refuse to accept this cognitive dissonance as their reality. In many ways, the internal struggles and societal contradictions are at war with themselves and embodied on stage in the character of Lola/Simon; described in the script as "a heterosexual crossdresser" whose pronouns throughout are she/her.

I have a deep admiration for this character.

As Simon, she is a meek and timid shell that has been beaten into submission. As Lola, she is transformed into a fearless Goddess that lives out loud and demands that all of the attention in the room be directed at her. I ache as I listen to Lola direct some of the most transphobic dialogue in this play back at herself. She repeats back the hate that has been inflicted upon her. She can't believe that she could possibly be a designer because, at her core, she believes the hateful and self-limiting reflection that others have projected onto her. I revel in Simon's anguished acceptance of Lola and her true nature while, in the same moment, Simon acknowledges the fact that she will never live up to her father's expectations. My parent's heart breaks as Simon shares her understanding that "the best part of me is what he could not see."

I love working in educational theatre. It has always been a safe place for all who want to participate, to create, to perform, to find their voice. Of course, our students wanted to continue this production under any circumstances. Because they know that, even with masks on, in the theatre we can breathe freely. We can live out loud. We can be profound. We can just be.




