SJS M110 Introduction to Social Justice Studies

Prerequisites: None

Hours: 3 lecture

C-ID: SJS 110 Aligned

Examines, via inter-disciplinary study, race and ethnicity in the United States. Examines social justice movements in relation to ethnic and racial groups in the United States. Provides a basis for a better understanding of the socio-economic, cultural, and political conditions among key social groups.

#### Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer Credit: CSU

Note: the course will be proposed for UC transfer (UC TCA) in June 2022 and IGETC/CSU GE in Dec. 2022 for effective Fall 2023.

Notes: This course is one of the required core classes of the Social Justice Studies TMC. It aligns with C-ID: SJS 110 and the addition of this class will allow students understanding of the issues of social justice in the United States, a vital issue of our times. The course aligns with Oxnard's SJS R110 Introduction to Social Justice Studies (3).

#### SJS M120 Introduction to Women's Studies

Prerequisites: None

Hours: 3 lecture

C-ID: SJS 120 Aligned

Introduces students to the origins, purpose, subject matter, and methods of Women's Studies and to feminist perspectives on a range of social issues affecting women of diverse backgrounds. Studies gender and its intersections with race, class, sexuality, dis/ability, age, religion, and other systems of difference.

Applies to Associate Degree. Transfer Credit: CSU

Note: the course will be proposed for UC transfer (UC TCA) in June 2022 and IGETC/CSU GE in Dec 2022 for effective Fall 2023.

Discusses and illustrates financial management principles associated with the landscape design/build, maintenance, and construction companies. Focuses on strategic planning, organization infrastructure, budgeting, pricing, estimating, job cost management, and proactive financial management. *Does NOT apply to Associate Degree.*

### ENSC M973 Management Principles for Landscape Contracting

Discusses and illustrates applications of business management practices to the landscape industry. Emphasizes human resource management in terms of federal employment compliance, employee motivation for productivity enhancement, professional development, and leadership qualities. Introduces the concept of lean management as a resource for increasing production efficiency, and profitability.

### Social Work and Human Services, Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T)

This degree will acquaint students with the fundamentals of the human services system and the profession of Social Work, including an introduction to the theories, principles, and values on which human services are offered and social work is practiced in the United States.

The Social Work/Human Services AA-T program prepares students for careers in the helping professions, may prepare students for the first two years of their transferable Human Services education, and enhances the skills of persons already employed in this field. In addition, students will be provided with personal/interpersonal skills needed to live healthy lives and deal with the stressful demands of daily living.

Human Services is a course of study for those interested in employment in such diverse settings as group homes and halfway houses; correctional facilities, developmental disability agencies, and community mental health centers; family, child, and youth service agencies; and programs concerned with alcoholism, drug abuse, family violence, homelessness, aging, or other social issues. The primary focus of the human service worker is to assist individuals and communities to function as effectively as possible in the major domains of living as case managers, advocates, grant writers, youth workers, volunteer coordinators, human resource specialists, fundraisers, trainers, or para-educators. The Human Services AA-T is structured around interrelated components, including theoretical foundations/intervention strategies, client population/cultural diversity, research/evaluation, and skill development/field experience. Successful completion of appropriate coursework will enable students to either further their education, seek employment in a variety of social service organizations, or both.

The Associate in Arts in Social Work and Human Services for Transfer (AA-T in Social Work and Human Services) is intended for students who plan to transfer and complete a Bachelor's degree in Social Work and Human Services, or a major deemed similar by a CSU campus. For a current list of what majors (and what options or areas of emphasis within that major) have been designated as "similar" to this degree at each CSU campus, please refer to the <u>CSU's Associate Degree</u> for Transfer Major and Campus Search website and seek guidance from a Moorpark College counselor. Students completing this degree are guaranteed admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major.

To earn an AA-T in Social Work and Human Services, students must:

1. Complete a minimum of 60 CSU-transferable semester units including both of the following:

a. Certified completion of the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education Breadth (CSU GE-Breadth) requirements.

b. A minimum of **28-31** semester units in the Social Work and Human Services major as listed in the Moorpark College catalog.

- 2. Obtain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 in all CSU-transferable coursework. While a minimum of 2.0 is required for admission, some majors may require a higher GPA. Please consult with a counselor for more information.
- 3. Obtain a grade of "C" or better or "P" in all courses required in the major. Even though a "pass-no-pass" is allowed (Title 5 § 55063), it is highly recommended that students complete their major courses with a letter grade.
- 4. Complete requirements in residency. For students in the Ventura County Community College District, a minimum of 12 units must be completed in residence at the college granting the degree.

Students transferring to a CSU campus that accepts the Social Work and Human Services AA-T will be required to complete no more than 60 units after transfer to earn a bachelor's degree (unless the major is a designated "high-unit" major at a particular campus). This degree may not be the best option for students intending to transfer to a particular CSU campus or to a university or college that is not part of the CSU system. Students should consult with a counselor when planning to complete the degree for more information on university admission and transfer requirements.
