

Student Privacy Rights

Moorpark College adheres to the guidelines established by the [Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act \(FERPA\)](#).

(<http://www2.ed.gov/policy/gen/guid/fpco/ferpa/index.html>) - a federal legislation established to regulate access and maintenance of student records.

FERPA affords students certain rights with respect to their education records, including the right to:

- Inspect their education records
- Request an amendment of the records that the student believes are inaccurate
- Control disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the students' education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.
- File a complaint with the [U.S. Department of Education](#) (<https://studentprivacy.ed.gov/file-a-complaint>) concerning alleged failures by the college to comply with the requirements of FERPA.

Parents, spouses and significant others have no inherent right to access student educational records.
