- (10) Processes for institutional planning and budget development
- (11) Other academic and professional matters as are mutually agreed upon between the governing board and the academic senate

#### A. Brown Act Teleconference Suspensions During a State of Emergency

New legislation modified the Brown Act, enabling virtual meetings during a state of emergency (Gov code Section 54953). Senate must agree that the emergency impacts the ability to meet safely in person and "make the findings" (reconsider emergency circumstances and its impact on meeting safely) every 30 days to continue virtual meetings.

#### B. Aspen Prize Brainstorming—What Makes Moorpark Unique?

Moorpark College has been selected as a candidate institution for the prestigious 2023 Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence. The Aspen Prize honors colleges with outstanding achievement in five critical areas: teaching and learning, certificate and degree completion, transfer and bachelor's attainment, workforce success, and equity for students of color and students from low-income backgrounds. By focusing on student success and lifting up models that work, the Aspen Prize aims to celebrate excellence, advance a focus on equitable student success, and stimulate replication of effective culture and practice. #### C. Proposed Institutional Student Learning Outcomes

#### D. DAC Position Requests

The District Administrative Center (DAC) is requesting 15 requests for a total cost of \$2.4 million. This roughly corresponds to a change in the budget allocation model from 7.1% to 8.3% for the DAC component and to an approximately 19% increase in the roughly \$12.9 million DAC budget.
